## Unemployment Payments High For Six Months

The Oregon unemployment compensation commission in the first half of 1946 paid out nearly 20 millions, more than the payments for the entire eight years of unemployment insurance up to V-J day. The total was divided as follows: Civilians \$13,249,821, veterans \$3,967,512, self-employed veterans \$305,093. Payments to covered civilian workers dropped off 27 per cent in June to \$1,501,736. Unemployed veterans received \$771,922, only two per cent less than in May. Veterans are paid by the state agency from federal funds under the G. I. Bill of Rights.

Despite record high benefits this year, Oregon's unemployment trust fund still is over the 66-million mark, a reduction of nearly eight millions since January 1. With contributions for the last half of the year estimated at six millions, the fund is expected to remain close to the present figure for the next few months. Taxes on second quarter pay rolls are due by July 31.

## Plapp Rejects West Point Bid

Fritz Plapp of Hillsboro, who returned home last Wednesday with his navy discharge after 20 months of service, has received and turned down an appointment from Senator Guy Corbin to West Point military academy.

Plapp had passed both the physical and mental examinations and as second alternate received the appointment after the principal and first alternate failed to qualify. Plapp gave health and the desire to remain in civilian life as his reasons for passing up the coveted opportunity. He was discharged at Bambridge, Maryland, as a seaman first class after serving overseas in the Hawaiian island.

His father, a veteran of World War I, who was a city mail carrier for 20 years, has been confined to the Veterans' hospital in Portland for the past two and a half years. A brother, Ernest W. Plapp Jr., served two years in the South Pacific with the Seabees. Fritz graduated from Hills in 1944, where he was a football letterman.

## Lyda Pleads Guilty To Assault Charge

William Ernest Lyda of route 1, Cornelius, charged with assault with a dangerous weapon, entered a plea of guilty in circuit court before Circuit Judge R. Frank Peters Saturday morning. The sentence was confined to a future date and the defendant allowed his liberty on conditions.

He was arrested by Deputy Sheriff Dick Busch on June 29 and released from the county jail two days later on \$5000 bail. He signed a waiver of indictment on July 3.

## S. P. Planning Safety Drive

## Barrymore New Arthritis Head

Lionel Barrymore, stage and screen actor, has been named chairman of the national board of sponsors of the National Arthritis Research Foundation. The news was made public following a special meeting in New York of the Foundation's officers.

The Foundation, to be located in Hot Springs National park, Arkansas, is to serve as the national center for the study of the causes, treatment and prevention of arthritis and other rheumatic conditions. A campaign for \$2,500,000 for the construction and equipment of buildings and for scientific personnel was revealed following a conference between President Harry S. Truman and leaders of the Foundation last February.

In his telegram of acceptance of the chairmanship, Mr. Barrymore said: "The crusade of the National Arthritis Research Foundation is a noble endeavor, and in its search for the possible causes and cures of this disabling disease merits the support of every American. For this reason, I accept the chairmanship of the national board of sponsors of the Foundation, fully confident that each of us will join in the endless effort to combat this enemy of mankind. It is my fervent hope that as a result of this enterprise the millions of men, women and children afflicted with arthritis may find ultimate relief. I do not hesitate to state that this is a great contribution to the American health."

## Traffic Death Rate Shows Small Decrease

Oregon's traffic death rate for the month of May dropped three points below the rate for the same month a year ago, according to Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell. The rate this May was ten persons killed per one hundred million miles of travel, compared to a rate of thirteen a year ago. Farrell said the actual death toll for May of this year was 37, compared to 31 for May of 1945. However, motorists ran up 371,999,644 miles on Oregon highways in May of this year, compared to 228,945,212 miles a year ago. The accident death rate indicates the number of persons killed in relation to exposure, as shown by motor vehicle use.

Farrell urged Oregon motorists to remember the increased traffic volumes on the highways today and to exercise greater care to avoid accidents.

## First National Bank Announces Drafting Contest
