

Hillsboro Flier To Top Seattle Army Air Show

Top billing in the army air forces air show at Seattle Saturday and Sunday goes to R. N. "Swede" Ralston, Hillsboro aviator. He will open the show at Seattle's Boeing field with his elaborate repertoire of advanced aerobatics in his AT-6 single-engine, 650 horsepower army plane.

Ralston gave a similar exhibition of aerobatics during the same type of show at the Portland army air base June 14 under the sponsorship of the Oregon civil air patrol. His performance led to the invitation to star in the Seattle show this week-end.

Following his aerobatics, Ralston will give a lesson in "how not to fly" performed close to the crowd in a 60-horsepower Cub trainer. Proceeds of the Seattle show is planned to raise funds for continuing of the Washington civil air patrol and will feature army planes in combat maneuvers.
