This is an all-expense trip for the girls and has been made possible through the co-operation of the Washington County Red Cross chapter. They will report their activities at the camp at the September meeting of Washington County Red Cross board, according to Mrs. Zeta F. Morgan, chairman.

There are five cabins for the girls in addition to the main lodge, shower house and other buildings. The camp holds 42 girls who are under the supervision of a director and staff of trained counselors.

Dr. Nelson will now have more time to give to his patients in diagnosing and prescribing diets and vitamins.

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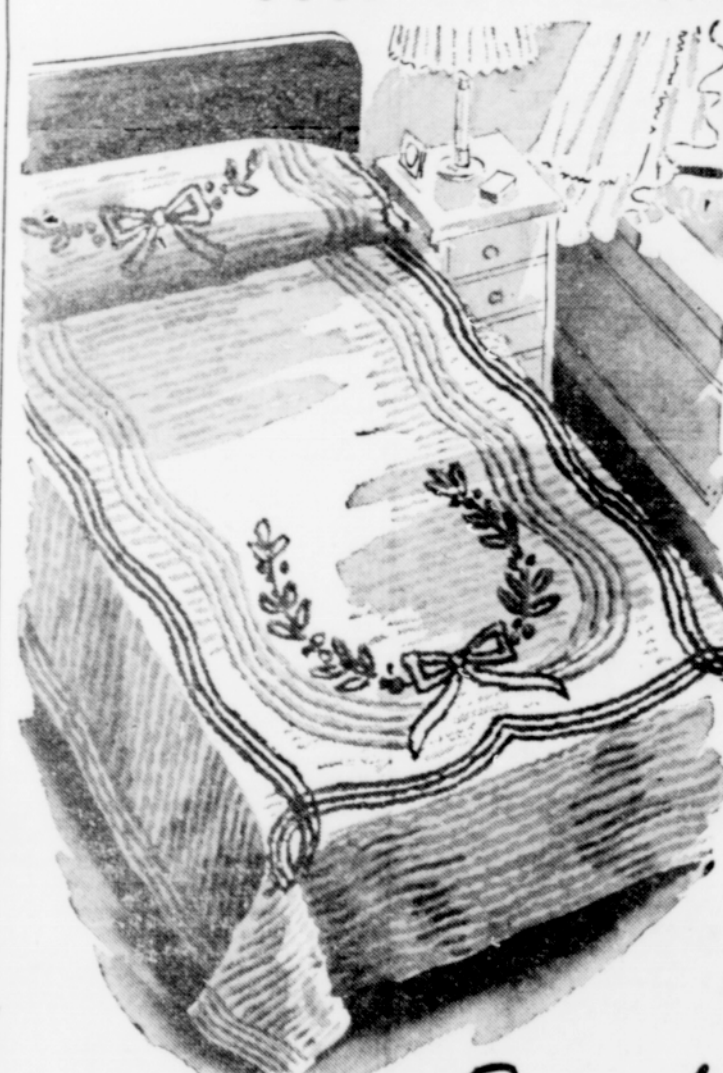
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
