Four-Lane Highway Needed
Traffic on the highway between Forest Grove and West Slope is and has been at a point where the state highway commission should give early earnest consideration to widening it.

The condition is so bad at the present time that many local people driving into Portland take the Cornell or Barnes roads in order to avoid congestion and greater traffic hazards.

Although the commission may feel that the new Sunset highway will bring considerable relief to the present traffic congestion on the Tualatin highway, the commissioners should take into account that with the growth of the Tualatin valley the traffic originating in the valley and from further south on this highway is such that a four-lane highway is a necessity.
