Notice is hereby given that pursuant to a resolution passed on motion of the City Council of the City of Hillsboro, that the City Council did on the 16th day of July, 1946, pass a resolution of intention to improve East Jackson Street from a point on the East line of North Sixth Avenue east to a point 9 feet westerly from the centerline of Cornell Road in the following manner, to-wit: By placing the macadam surface to the proper grade, and crown preparatory to placing asphaltic pavement surface and by constructing thereon an asphaltic concrete surface 2 inches in thickness and 26 feet in width between the East line of North Sixth Avenue and the West line of North Seventh Avenue extended Northwesterly and 2 inches in thickness and 10 feet in width from the west line of North Seventh Avenue extended Northwesterly and a point 9 feet West of the centerline of Cornell Road, and do such other work as will make said improvement a good and workable job and assess the cost of such improvement to the abutting properties in accordance with the provisions of the City Charter.
