

### Center Planned By Schools to Aid War Vets

An information center to keep Oregon World War II veterans posted on educational and housing facilities in all state and independent colleges and universities in Oregon will soon be set up in the Department of Veterans Affairs, Salem, it was announced this week.

Department of Public Instruction Rex Putnam, it was decided that such an information center should be established, and Edward T. Taggart, education officer for the Department of Veterans Affairs, was named coordinator.

All schools of higher learning will fill out forms and return them to the Department of Veterans Affairs office, listing the housing facilities available and the type of courses and instruction which can be offered incoming students.

When the information is compiled, it will be sent back to all the schools, and also to every veteran's guidance center in the state, so that veterans can be informed at all times as to their chances

of getting college entry.

School officials attended the session from the University of Oregon, Oregon State college, Williamette university, University of Portland, Pacific university, Reed college, Maryhurst college, Mt. Angel college, Multnomah college, Oregon College of Education, and Lewis and Clark college.

### Vanport College Attracts Vets

VANPORT — Analysis of data provided in registration papers of the 220 students attending Vanport Center college shows that 94 per cent of the students are veterans with an average length of service of 34 months. Dr. Stephen E. Epler, director of the extension college, believes that Vanport has a higher percentage of veterans in the student body than other institutions in the country.

Thirty-one of the Vanport veterans are disabled. Eight of the veterans are women. Half of the Vanport veterans served in the army, 37 per cent in the navy, eight per cent in the marine corps and five per cent in the coast guard.

Students are commuting from Beaverton, Oregon City, Troutdale, Camas, Kelso and Vancouver. Although 26 states are represented by the birthplaces of students, 73 per cent are Oregon born.

Dr. Epler said registrations for the fall term are already being accepted.

### Nation Honors Army Air Force

Today (Thursday), August 1, has been proclaimed army air forces day to honor the beginning of the nation's air arm in 1907, according to Capt. W. H. Seigle of the United States army recruiting service Oregon district office for the sixth army area at Portland.

On that day, 25 years after the turn of the century, an aeronautical division to study the flying machine and the possibility of adapting it to military purposes was established in the office of the chief signal officer of the United States army. One officer and two enlisted men were assigned to the division. There were no airplanes.

When we went to war on April 6, 1917, the aviation section of the U. S. army signal corps had 85 officers (35 of them fliers) and 1087 enlisted men, with a total of 55 airplanes. By the end of the war the nation had what could accurately be called an air force and it developed until in World War II it played a major part in defeat of the enemy.

### J. W. Kyle Rites Held on Wednesday

Funeral services for Joseph William Kyle, 84, retired farmer, who died Monday at Astoria, were held Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the funeral home of Rev. H. E. Sias officiating. Burial was at Gales Creek.

He had been living with his son at Jewell for the past few years and lived at Gales Creek for many years prior to that.

### Former Hillsboro Resident Passes

Warren David Dobbins, who spent his young manhood days in Hillsboro, died in St. Helens Saturday, and funeral services were held Monday afternoon at Roger & Colman chapel in that city, with interment in the Scappoose cemetery.

He is survived by his wife, Gertrude Dobbins; two sons, David and Warren Dobbins, and two daughters, Mrs. Lucile McGeorge and Jane Dobbins.

### Deadline Set for Post Office Exam

James P. Cooley, director of the 11th civil service region, Seattle, announced that the closing date for the receipt of application for the first post-war examination for post office clerk and carrier will be extended to August 12, 1946. This will be the first examination for a permanent position of this type since 1936.
