

Seaside Plans Two Events for Early August

SEASIDE—Two big special events are scheduled for Seaside in the first two weeks of August. One will mark the resumption of an event which was started 25 years ago, and the other is a fete for 150 Purple Heart veterans from the Veterans hospital, Portland.

On Tuesday, August 6, Seaside Post 99 American Legion and Auxiliary will serve an old-fashioned Boston-Seaside clam chowder in the beachfront to 150 heroes of World War II. Legion members and merchants are donating the ingredients and digging clams for the affair. The chowder will be cooked and served by the Auxiliary.

On August 14, the annual Dahlia Parade will be held, under direction of Mrs. Edna Dawson, who has supervised this event for the past 25 years, except for the recent war period. There will be about 35 tiny floats, manned by children, with a Dahlia Parade Queen and eight Princesses, all honor students of the Seaside school's first grade. A band also will be in the parade, and Chamber of Commerce Manager Merrill Meade is now seeking a school band for that purpose.

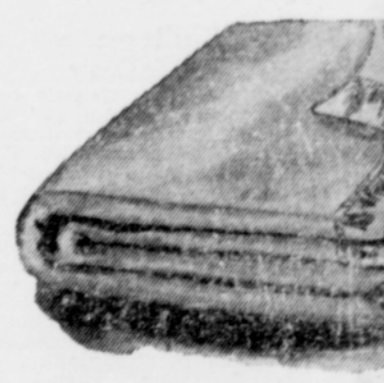
