OPA Back With Us Again

OPA is back after President Truman reluctantly signed it in the belief that the compromise legislation was the best he could get out of congress. Controls were slapped back on immediately, but many price increases that were pending because of increased costs at the time the old measure expired were allowed. These increases were granted under provisions of the old price control law which required industry earnings to be maintained at the 1936-39 level.

Whether or not meat, dairy products and other items conditionally exempt from ceilings, shall continue free of controls after August 20 will be decided by a demarcated board of three men of "judgment and fairness" appointed by the president.

The most significant thing about the period of no controls was that there was not the flurry of price increases that some expected and OPA had predicted. The great majority of retailers and wholesalers carried through with their determination to hold prices down and to demonstrate that they were not chiselers. American business had as great a stake in an orderly economy as anyone and certainly is interested in preventing inflation and holding prices and profits within reason, fully realizing that inflation can only lead to disaster. Undoubtedly there were exceptions to the hold-the-line principle, but a few gougers and chiselers can usually be found in any group.

Although prices went up on some commodities, mostly foods such as butter, milk, flour and some meats, it was the result of removing government subsidies, which people were saving without realizing it.

The great majority of landlords joined in the hold-the-line objective in an effort to keep rents from soaring. Tenants, naturally, had occasion to rejoice over the return of controls because the serious housing shortage could easily have driven rentals to prohibitive amounts. There are some inequities both ways as to rents, houses and apartments put up for rent since the beginning of OPA are too high in many instances while in a good many cases some landlords were caught with rentals that were too low when OPA went into effect, particularly when compared with rentals that later received official approval.

"Judgment and fairness" toward existing inequities would have resulted in a better feeling toward OPA. Some control seems logical in view of the many shortages and the surplus buying power, but conditions certainly point to the need for the agency being less arbitrary.

When production more nearly reaches demand the country will be better off with less government control and regulation. Through freedom of enterprise, America has grown great and developed the highest standard of living known to man. If government control and regulation can gradually be eased in the coming months it should be a stimulant to business generally. Competition and good business judgment will hold the line.

A Prayer for Peace Conference

Hearings for all nations, including former enemy states, at the 21-nation peace conference that convened in Paris Monday are being urged by American Secretary of State Byrnes. If the representatives of all participating countries would enter the conference in the same spirit it would help greatly in promoting the understanding so essential to permanent world peace. Prayers of all of the people of the world will be for a successful conference in which every nation makes an honest effort to iron out the differences that make for war. To make this possible a spirit of give and take, to live and let live and a true desire on the part of all for world peace, are absolutely essential.
