### Officer Transfer Deadline Set

With minor exceptions, no applications from naval reserve and temporary U. S. navy officers for transfer to the regular navy will be accepted after September 15, 1946, the navy department has announced.

The deadline will affect all eligible officers now on active duty or terminal leave, and those on inactive duty who desire to request transfer to the regular navy.

The September 15 deadline does not apply to officers who request transfer as law specialists, officers who will have completed less than one year's commission service by that date, or officers who receive their first commission subsequent to September 15, 1946.

July 20 was previously announced by the navy department as a deadline for transfer of navy chief warrant and warrant officers to the regular navy.

The announcement applies to more than 5000 officers living in the thirteenth naval district, including those on inactive duty, terminal leave, and active status.

### Walter McKinney Given Discharge from Navy

Walter V. McKinney, 31, son of Mr. and Mrs. Verne McKinney of Hillsboro, was discharged from the navy at Bremerton, Wash., Wednesday after 15 months of service. He served on Guam for a time and was later transferred to the USS Langa Point, an escort carrier, which returned to the United States for decommissioning at Tacoma, Wash. A 1945 Hill graduate, Walter was active in student affairs and football.

### Many Receiving Federal Benefits

On July 1 exactly 700 residents of Washington county were receiving monthly federal old-age and survivors insurance checks amounting to over \$14,500, or at an annual rate of nearly \$175,000, according to James E. Peebles, manager of the Portland field office of the Social Security administration.

Peebles says the number of beneficiaries of this federal family insurance has increased approximately 60 per cent in a year's time in Washington county. Major groups of the beneficiaries are 593 retired wage earners; 88 wives, age 65 or over, of retired workers; 193 young widows and children; and 23 widows age 65 or over.

POSTHUMOUS AWARDS — The air medal and gold star in lieu of the second air medal, awarded posthumously to Ensign Philip C. Stretcher, have been received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Stretcher of Hillsboro.

### Stretcher Given Award by Navy

The late Ensign Philip Carlton Stretcher of Hillsboro, who was lost on a routine patrol flight on a PB4Y plane in the Makassar Straits area June 16, 1945, has been posthumously awarded the gold star in lieu of the third air medal, it was announced by the navy.

Stretcher also won the following: aid medal, gold star in lieu of second air medal, purple heart, American area campaign medal, Asiatic-Pacific campaign medal (one bronze star), Philippine Liberation ribbon (one bronze star) and World War II Victory medal.

He was a son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Merrill Stretcher. The navy announced in June of this year that Ensign Stretcher is officially presumed dead. He was graduated from Hill in 1940 and attended Linfield college for two years prior to entering service.

The air medal and gold star in lieu of the second air medal, along with the citations, were received Monday by Mr. and Mrs. Stretcher. Citation in connection with the air medal reads as follows: "For meritorious achievement in aerial flight as co-pilot of a navy search plane, attached to patrol bombing squadron III in action against enemy Japanese forces in Borneo on April 19, 1945. Ensign Stretcher contributed materially to the destruction of two enemy vessels, the probable destruction of another and the infliction of severe damage on two others. Maintaining constant surveillance over enemy activities, he repeatedly pressed home his daring attacks with determined skill and aggressiveness, despite shattering fire from enemy guns and was instrumental in destroying four enemy vessels and in the probable destruction of four others. His superb airmanship and cool courage under hazardous conditions reflect great credit upon Ensign Stretcher and upon the United States Naval service.

The citation for the gold star in lieu of the second air medal reads as follows: "For meritorious achievement in aerial flight... in action against enemy Japanese forces from February 26 to March 25, 1945. Alert and aggressive. En-
