An honor roll of those from Washington county who gave their lives for their country in World War II should be erected on the court house square or placed in a suitable glass case in the court house lobby. As no such roll was ever provided in the county for those who sacrificed their lives in World War 1 and the Spanish-American war it would be very fitting if their names were also included in such an honor roll.

This is a project that should be undertaken by all veteran groups in co-operation and with the wholehearted assistance of county officials. It would take some time to secure all the names and to check them carefully. The county newspapers, we are sure, would gladly help in appealing to the people of the county for the names of the honored dead so as to have the roll as accurate as possible. The Argus pledges its full co-operation.

Many other communities have such honor rolls or are arranging for them. Portland has one in the Park blocks so that all may see and read as to who made the supreme sacrifice and to whom we all owe a debt of gratitude that can never be repaid. The loving care of such an honor roll in a prominent place should serve as a constant inspiration for better citizenship on the part of all of us.
