Is it true? A—Yes, and it also condemns those who make others drunk. "Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God." 1 Corinthians 6:10. Q—Can you give one definite Bible prophecy that has been historically fulfilled? A—Yes, a dozen; but here is one. Speaking of the city of Tyre, once called the "Mistress of the Sea," the prophet Ezekiel said: "And I will cause the noise of thy songs to cease; and the sound of thy harps shall be no more heard. And I will make thee like the top of a rock; thou shalt be a place to spread nets upon; thou shalt be built no more; for I the Lord have spoken it, saith the Lord God." Ezekiel 26:13, 14.
