BIBLE QUESTIONS ANSWERED BY THE VOICE OF PROPHECY INTERNATIONAL BIBLE BROADCASTER
Question—Why do we see pictures of Jesus as a shepherd?
Answer—In John 10:11 it says: "I am the Good Shepherd; the Good Shepherd giveth His life for the sheep." (See also verse 11.)
Q.—Do you think our life here will affect our destiny in the other world?
A.—It is written in Matthew 16:27: "For the Son of man shall come in the glory of His Father with His angels; and then He shall reward every man according to his works."
Q.—Is there anything in the Scriptures about holding religious meetings by a riverside?
A.—Yes, there is, in Acts 16:13: "And on the Sabbath we went out of the city by a river side, where prayer was wont to be made; and we sat down, and spake unto the women which resorted thither." (See also Ezra 3:21-23.)
Q.—I hear some preachers use the words "Syria" and "Assyria" interchangeably. Are they the same?
A.—While "Syria" is an abbreviated form of Assyria, the name usually refers to a country north of the land of Israel, with Damascus as its capital. "Assyria" was the great empire far to the east with its capital at Nineveh. (Isaiah 7:8; 2 Kings 19:36.)
Q.—Were not the disciples gathered to partake of the communion on the morning that Christ arose and appeared to them?
A.—Read Luke 24:41-43: "And while they yet believed not for joy, and wondered, He said unto them, Have ye here any meat? And they gave Him a piece of a broiled fish, and of an honeycomb. And he took it, and did eat before them." Fish and honey are never used at communion services.
Q.—Does the Holy Bible predict any strong international peace agitation in the latter days?
A.—It does in the prophecy of Micah 4:1-3: "But in the last days... many nations shall come, and say, Come, and let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, and to the house of the God of Jacob;... He shall judge among many people, and rebuke strong nations afar off; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruninghooks; nation shall not lift up a sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more."
