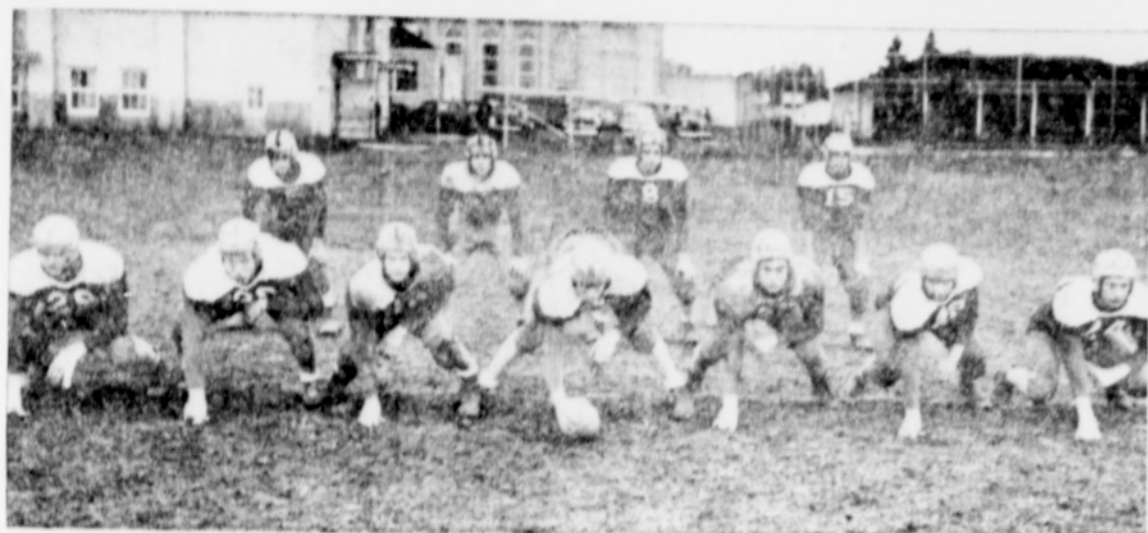

Banks high school football team has completed a successful season under Coach Don Klein, winning eight games and being held to one tie in nine games against "A" and "B" squad teams from other high schools in this area.

The Braves rolled up a 47-to-0 triumph over the Forest Grove reserves in their first game, followed that with a narrow 14-to-13 win over Vernonia, and then willoped Gaston, 41 to 0. Vernonia was then beaten again, 14 to 6, and the Banks gridders followed that with a 33-to-0 win over Gaston.

With reserves playing a lot of the time, the Braves downed the Forest Grove "B" again, 34 to 0, and followed that with another easy triumph over Nehalem in their seventh game, 35 to 0. Banks then beat Wheeler, 25 to 0, in impressive style, and was held to a scoreless tie by the same team in a muddy contest.

Beaverton Clinches Second Play in TYV League by Tipping Hilhi, 31-14

Hilli's gridders gave Beaverton a tough, exciting struggle for one half of last Friday's battle for second place in the TYV league, twice fighting from behind to take the lead, but succumbed to a second half offensive to lose 31 to 14, on the Beaver's home field.

In the end it was accurate passes from the arm of Jack O'Connor, captain and quarterback, that spelled doom for the Spartans and dumped them into a tie with Forest Grove for fourth position in the league. O'Connor fired three touchdown passes to End Ed Harrison.

George McCorkle, center of the game, came almost simultaneously with Hilli's loss of Guards Terry Christensen and Jack Shearer and Quarterback Tom Six, who were out of the game in the second half because of injuries. Hilli walked off the field at halftime holding a 14 to 12 lead. Christensen, a bulldog on defense and a good blocker, received a bad cut over his left eye which required three stitches. Shearer received a blow on the head and Six got a chocky-horse in the first half.

Willie Laird, wee Spartan left half, upheld his responsibilities as captain by turning in a sterling game. He pitched one touchdown pass to End Wally Sigler and ran 59 yards for the other Hilli score besides making several timely last-gitch tackles and keeping the Beavers in hot water several times with accurate punting.

A Hilli fumble late in the first quarter paved the way for the first Beaverton score. The Beavers recovered the ball on the Hillsboro 27. One pass went incomplete. O'Connor then faded and heaved a long one to McCorkle in the end zone. The try for point was no good. Beaverton 6, Hilli 0.

The score remained that way until early in the second quarter when the Spartans tallied from the six after an offside penalty. Laird fired a pass to End Wally Sigler in the end zone for the score. Forest Henning was rushed into the game to placekick the extra point. Hilli 7, Beaverton 6. That touchdown came at the end of a 65-yard drive by Hilli from the kick-off after the first Beaver score. The Spartans had reached the Beaverton 46 for a first down when the first quarter ended. A few moments later, with the ball on the 44, Laird fired a pass down the middle to Halfback Randall Harrison.

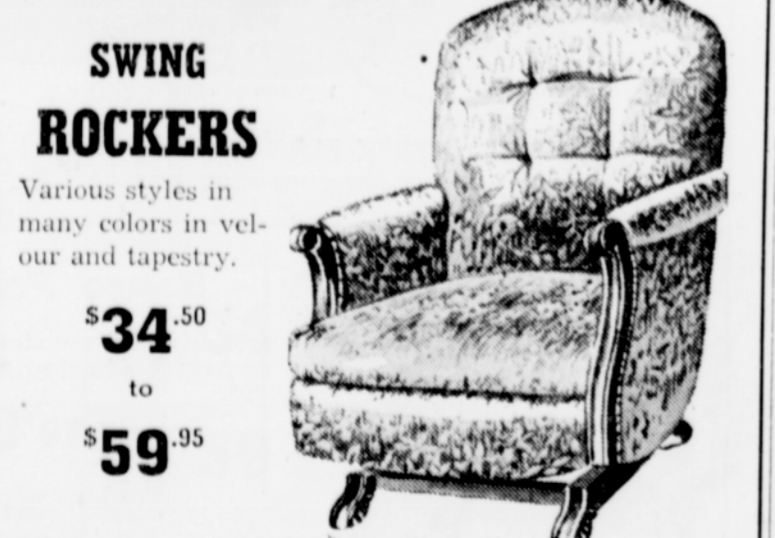
