## Poultry Outlook To Be Discussed

N. L. Bennion, extension poultryman from Oregon State college, will discuss "the poultry and turkey situation and outlook" at two meetings in the county Tuesday, November 26, according to Joe Cox, assistant county agent.

A meeting of turkey growers will be held Tuesday at 1:30 p. m. in the chamber of commerce rooms in Hillsboro when Bennion will speak on the 1947 situation and outlook. support bill, the legislators were asked to keep the increased tax off property. Other suggestions were no reduction on income tax, and a sales tax earmarked for school and old age assistance, with a clause indicating that if such a bill is voted it would provide for a reduction on property tax. Relief was indicated by many at the meeting that if such a bill were placed before the voters it would pass by a large majority.

On the matter of new building project in the county, Senator Patterson suggested that county zoning might be in order with controls over what can be built outside the city limits. This would force sub-dividers to provide sanitation facilities along with the building plans, it was explained. The group approved this proposal. Senator Patterson suggested that citizens make a study of bills as they are presented to legislature. He said "Copies of the various bills will be available in limited number. Criticism for or against the bills will be appreciated as in this way we know best the wishes of the people we represent."

Henry R. Johnson, president of the county Farmers Union, presided at the meeting, and Mrs. Theresa Benscoter, secretary of the Laurel-Schools local, was acting secretary of the day. Mrs. Georgia E. Sawyer is reporter for the county organization.
