Garments shipped to the area office during the period from May 1 to December 1, 1,324: pine garments, 103 pairs bedroom slippers, 100 pairs bedsocks, 13 afghan 200 pairs socks, 341 wash cloths, sewed, 243 bedside bags.

Knitting—Mrs. Minnie Cull, chairman. Sweaters shipped to the area office during the period from May 1 to December 1, 1,134. Estimated time required to complete the above items is 7,000 hours. According to Mrs. Mildred Anderson, production chairman, ladies are needed now to cut in the rooms, and groups are needed to take sewing out. Work on hand consists of knit bags, bed garments and children's clothing. The production rooms are open on Thursday afternoons from 1 to 4 and the location is in the rear of the Tom Shuck Barber shop at 146 South Second Avenue, Hillsboro.

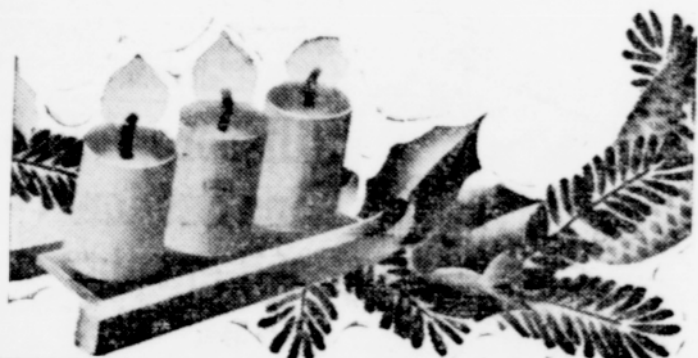
