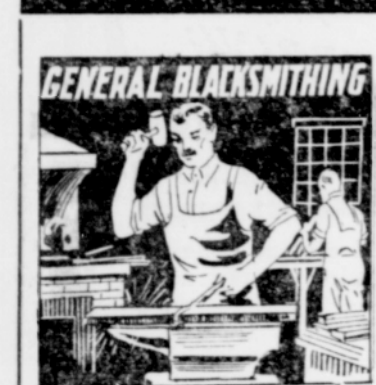
Farm Union to Meet

Highway Deaths Show Increase

Oregon's highway death rate mounted to 11.9 for the first month of this year, it has been announced by the Secretary of State Robert S. F.reller. A total of 39 lives were lost during the month. "This rate of 11.9 is above the average for 1946 and above the rate for January of last year," said F.reller. "That is an ominous sign." The rate is figured as the number of traffic deaths per 100,000,000 miles of auto travel. Specialists consider it a much more reliable index to the safety picture than the simple number of fatalities. Farrell explained that the high rate figure means that, mile after mile, travel has been more hazardous this year than last. Rural accidents are continuing to account for most of the deaths.
