

Group at Local Rotary Told of Relief Project

An appeal for support and leadership in the campaign for "Heifers for Relief," was made at the Rotary club luncheon Thursday by J. Handsaker of Portland, executive secretary.

The project is a unique relief plan originated by the Church of the Brethren to bring fresh milk to little children in war devastated countries where so many are undernourished and face starvation, according to Handsaker. Under this plan grade heifers are raised on American farms, bred to pure bred sires and shipped to Europe to become fresh soon after arrival, thus providing milk for immediate relief. It was explained.

Rotary, he said, should exemplify the spirit of international brotherhood by giving full co-operation in the project, which he held would do much for the preservation of peace. The good fellowship that is in Rotary is of great importance in creating better understanding. It was stressed.
