Henry Ford, noted automobile manufacturer, died Monday night at Detroit at the age of 83. Just a little more than a year and half ago he retired from active direction of the great industrial empire he founded in 1903.

County Officials Given Pay Boost

A high point of the recent session of the state legislature as far as Washington county officials is concerned was passage of the bill calling for salary increases ranging from \$120 to \$360 annually, from and after July 1, 1947. The measure was signed by Governor Snell and is a recommendation of the county budget committee, having been a part of the budget which was approved by the people last June.

Present salaries, set by an act passed in 1945 for the period beginning July 1, 1945, and ending July 1 of this year are to be increased as follows:

Judge and sheriff, \$2,640 to \$3,000 each; commissioners, \$800 to \$880 per day for each day employed in transaction of county business; treasurer, \$1,980 to \$2,100; assessor, clerk and school superintendent, \$2,420 to \$2,700 each. The measure was introduced by the county delegation.

Control Said Due For Spittle Bug

It is now time to make the first application of rotenone dust to control spittle bug in most strawberry growing sections, reports Palmer S. Torvond, county agent.

Growers are advised to check their own fields for the presence of spittle bug as the emergence will vary with the elevation of the field. Dusting should start as soon as the insects appear in number.

Rotenone is the only insecticide being recommended for control at the present time. Either a one-half of one per cent or three-fourths of one per cent rotenone dust applied at the rate of 50 to 60 pounds per acre may be used. Generally a hooded row sprayer, pump sprayer or hand duster has been the most effective equipment for applying dust, although hand dusters may be used to advantage on small acreages. Dusting should be done on a day when the weather outlook is fair. Special care should be taken to thoroughly dust every part of the under sides of the leaves. If a second application is necessary it should be made about two weeks after the first dusting if spittle masses reappear.
