Mr. and Mrs. E. J. Sutherland of Portland spent a week visiting relatives here.

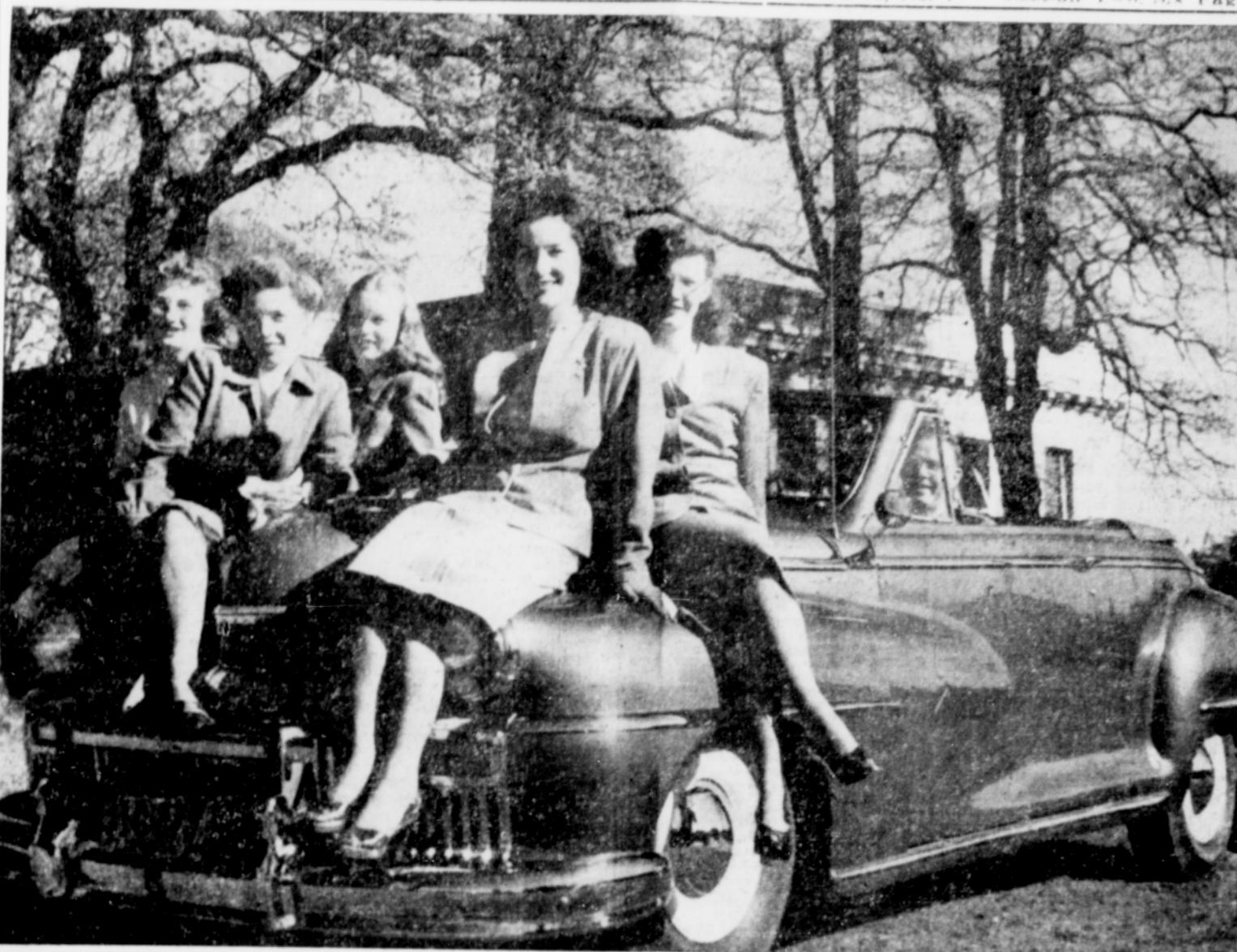
Miss Bolen Honored

HOT LAKE, Oregon—When Dr. Marcus Whitman broke the first wagon trail across the Oregon country with his brave band of homeseekers, it was on October 1, 1843, that he looked down from the mountains upon the beautiful Grande Ronde valley in Eastern Oregon and eventually came to the hot mineral spring which has become known throughout the northwest.

This spring, which flows 2,500,000 gallons of water every 24 hours, contains a variety of minerals. The water is 238 degrees hct, the boiling point at this altitude. For more than a century, people have been coming here to drink and bathe in the waters from this spring. The Hot Lake Sanatorium and resort is open the year round and is under direction of Dr. A. J. Roth.

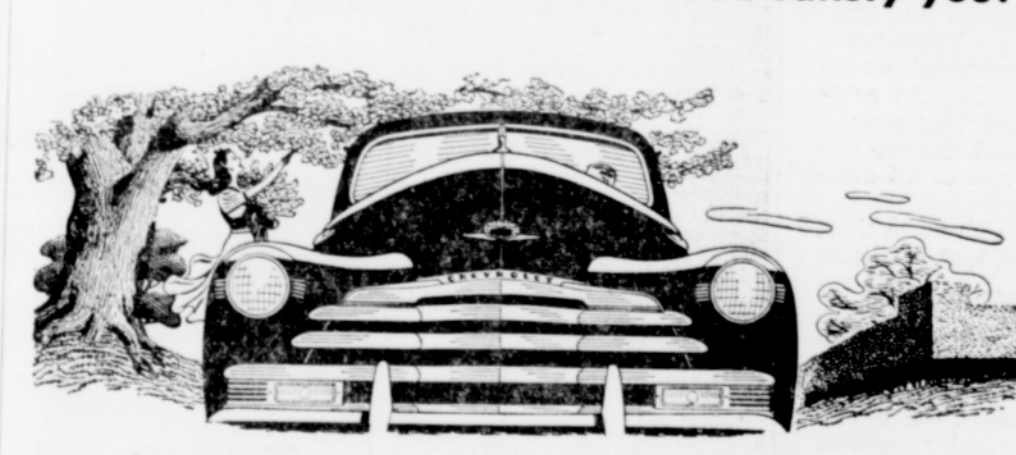
