Mrs. A. L. Brock Funeral Friday

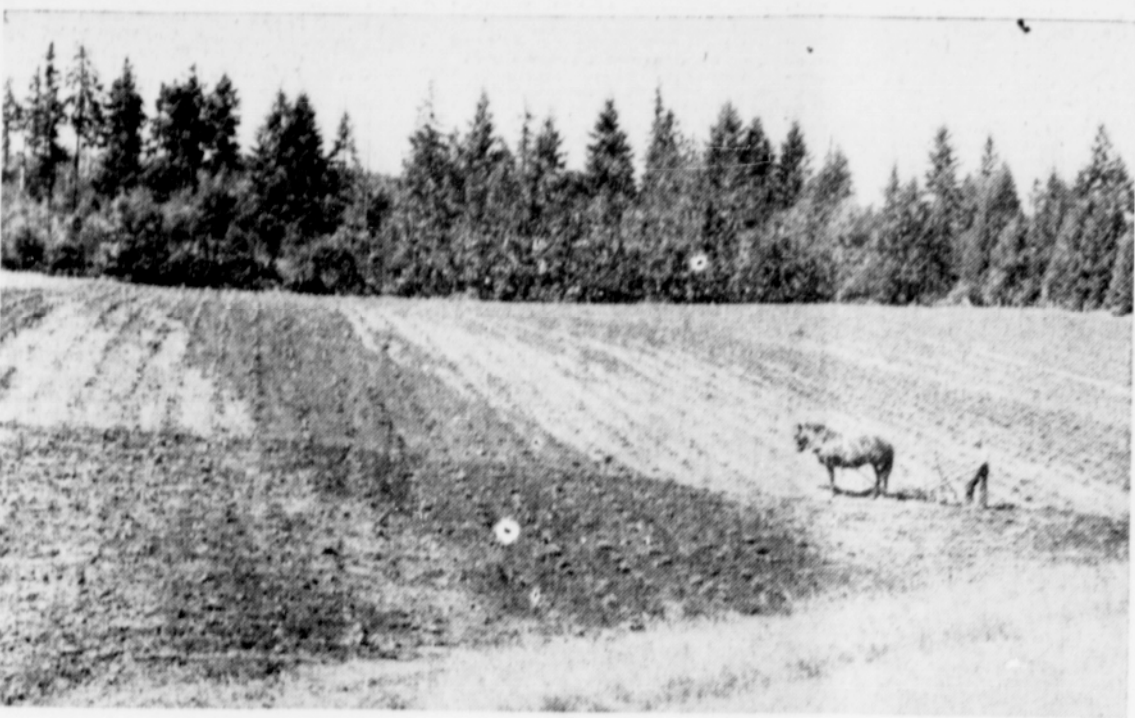
