

McGinn Building To Be Completed Here in August

The McGinn apartment building, one of the most modern in western Oregon, will be completed in August with all 24 apartments occupied, J. B. McGinn, owner, said this week.

The \$150,000 structure, featuring the latest ideas in design and furnishing, now houses 21 families.

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McGinn said. Three basement apartments will be occupied within the next few weeks, he added.

Construction on the fireproof building started April 5, 1946, and was delayed several times due to shortages of materials. The L-shaped structure, which is to be finished on the outside with white stucco texture, has 24,000 feet of floor space. It runs west 126 feet from First avenue and north 82 feet to a 33-foot entrance on Lincoln.

Made of reinforced concrete, the building has 18 one-bedroom apartments and six 2-bedroom apartments. Living rooms measure 12 by 20 feet, dinettes 9 by 10 feet, and bedrooms 11 by 13 and 9 by 11 feet. The compact kitchens, measuring 8 1/2 by 12 feet, are furnished with electric ranges and refrigerators. Heat, provided by low-pressure hot water, laundry facilities, venetian blinds, garbage disposal, parking facilities and hot and cold water are also furnished. Bathrooms are equipped with showers and tubs.

First of the 24 apartments was occupied April 19 of this year. About half of the occupants are war veterans, McGinn said. Planting of lawns and shrubbery will start early in August, he added.

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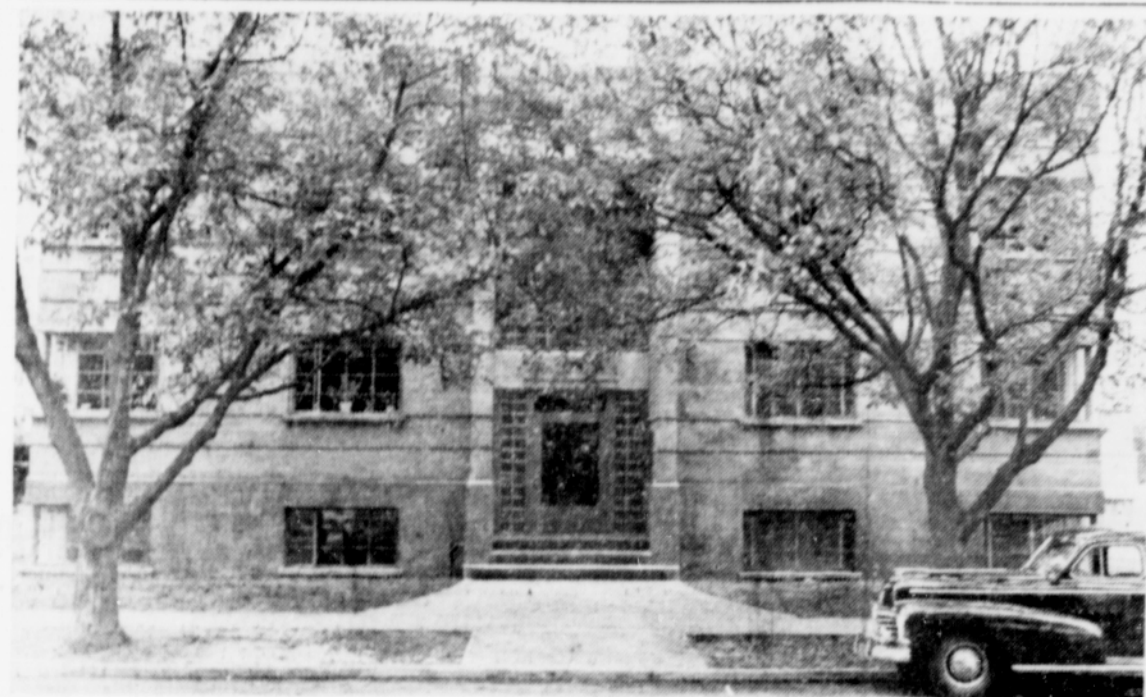
