

## Sudtoll Constructing Building At West Slope; Speed Limit 25

WEST SLOPE — Construction of a building 40,000 feet to house a war surplus store has begun by Owen Sudtoll on S. W. Canyon road, across from Haskell's shopping center. The building will be made of cement blocks, will be ready for occupancy by September 5, and has already been leased to Charlie Collins, J. M. Ayers, contractor. This is the first suit of a group of buildings planned for erection by Sudtoll.

The first of two new homes being constructed in the new Vista Hills restricted subdivision just off Canyon road and east of Walker road, was occupied this week by Dr. and Mrs. Wayne Stratford and family, who moved to their \$25,000 home in the new area. Over half of the 40 lots, measuring 100 by 150 feet, which were placed on the market in March by J. A. Miller, have been sold. Four other homes besides Dr. Stratford's are being constructed and others planned as soon as materials become more plentiful. The area is restricted to homes cost not less than \$15,000. Paving of the roads was finished last week, water already in, and electricity will be installed this week.

The steep hill of the present level makes it difficult in winter weather, when the ground is slippery, to make the grade. Plans call for raising the road level about eight feet, but work on it will not be started till next year. The survey was made at the request of property owners of the side of the highway, who plan to erect a building and wanted to know the permanent level of the road before planning further construction.
