### Vets' School to Add 8 Courses

Eight new classes will be added to the curriculum of the Oregon Vocational school at Klamath Falls effective Monday. It was revealed this week by Dolph Stuart, county service officer.

The new course to run from 8:00 to 1:00 hours for completion, are: auto mechanics, body and fender work, cooks and bakers, radio repair, refrigeration service, diesel mechanics, woodworking and carpentering.

Housing accommodations in apartments are now being remodelled in the marine barracks to make room for veterans and their families, Stuart said. Apartments for families will rent for \$35 a month, with heat, lights, water, garbage disposal, cooking facilities and furniture provided by the school. Veterans must provide linens, crockery and personal effects. Smaller apartments with no cooking facilities are to be available for \$26 a month. Single students housed four in a room, will pay \$11 a month. Rooms housing two students or a veteran and his wife will rent for \$13 a month. A cafeteria, already in operation, furnishes meals for \$37.50 a month. A veteran's subsistence pay is adequate to cover living expenses, he added, and considerable student aid in the form of part-time work will be available to help veterans financially.

Veterans must have certificates of eligibilities when entering the school. Certificates can be obtained from Stuart in the county court house in Hillsboro. For further information on the school veterans should contact Winston D. Purvine, director, Oregon Vocational School, Box 1049, Klamath Falls.

### Kramien Challenge Issued to Carpenters

Kramien, Portland magician who claims to know many of the secrets which made Houdini immortal, will be featured at the Washington county fair next week in an act designed to challenge the craftsmanship of local carpenters.

The escape artist last week issued a challenge to all of the county's post-war carpenters that none could build a packing case that would baffle him. The six-foot two-inch magician said he would crawl into the case on the three afternoons of the fair, local carpenters would seal the case with nails, and within a few seconds Kramien would be out of the case.

If none of the local carpenters accept the challenge to build an "escape proof" box, the fair board will select one or two men to construct it. Construction, to be of 12 boards and the necessary nails and cleats to make it secure, is to take place where all can witness it.

Kramien is of the opinion that, regardless of how well the packing case is nailed, he will be able to escape within a few seconds after the last nail has been driven. A
