Mrs. Stretcher 90 Years of Age Dies at Scholls

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at 1:30 at the Scholls Methodist church for Mrs. Mary A. Stretcher, 90, who died Sunday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. E. E. Lovgren, at Scholls. Services were conducted by Rev. Harry Chatterton, and favorite songs of the deceased were sung by the church choir. Graveside services were held at Lincoln Memorial Park cemetery, Portland, with W. E. Pugh, Beaverton, funeral director.

Mary Ann Harmon was born at Elwood, Indiana, July 6, 1857, and was married to John A. Stretcher on February 12, 1880. Mr. Stretcher died in 1913.

The Stretcher families moved to Oregon in 1912, and settled near West Union. Mrs. Stretcher moved to Portland and then to Scholls, where she had made her home for about 20 years, the last 16

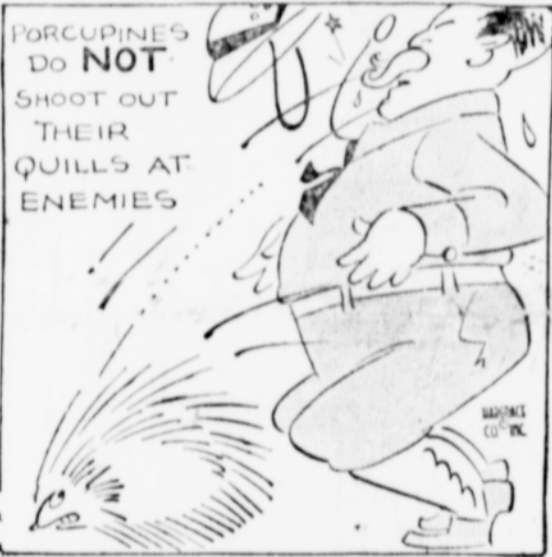

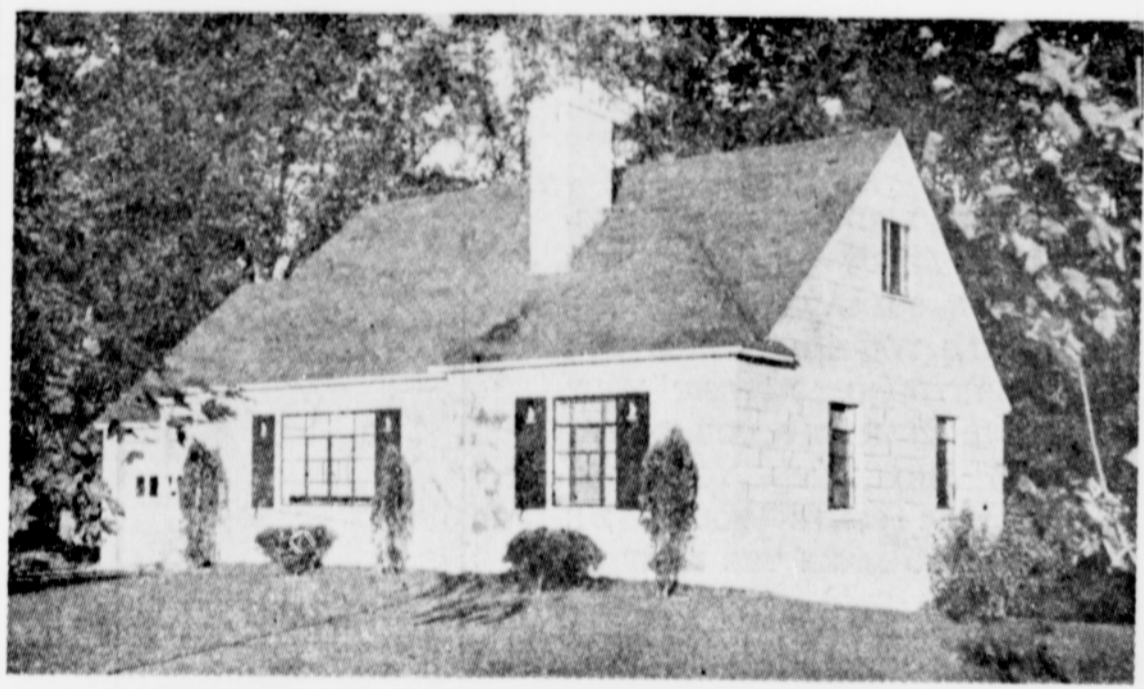

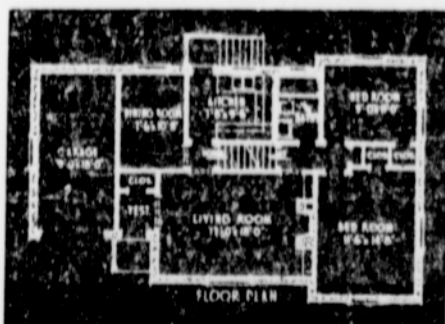
