Schools to Note Education Week

The Hillsboro public schools will join with schools and lay groups throughout the state in observance of American Education Week, November 9 to 15, according to J. W. Poynter, superintendent of local elementary schools.

Under the state-wide plan for an "open house" in each school to give the public an opportunity to meet teachers, David Hill grade school will be open to the public Thursday afternoon, November 13, and Peter Boscow and B. W. Barnes schools will be open Friday afternoon, November 14. The open house events will be observed while classes are in operation.

Poynter invited the public to participate in the celebration, which is co-sponsored in Oregon by the Oregon Department of the American Legion, the Congress of Parents and Teachers, the State Department of Education and the Oregon Education Association.

The Hillsboro high school open house will be held early in December when the new shop building will be formally opened. Principal John R. Cox announced.

Bangs Disease Hearing Monday

A public hearing to determine whether or not all bovine animals over six months of age within Washington county are to be tested at least once a year for Bangs disease will be held at 10 a. m. in the county court room in Hillsboro, it was announced by County Judge H. D. Kerkman.

The hearing will be conducted by the county court as a result of a petition signed by over 100 county cattle owners requesting the tests. Recent amendments to the 1943 Bangs disease laws require a public hearing when a petition requesting yearly inspections is signed by more than 100 cattle owners within the county.

Two Months Left for Conversion of NSLI

Veterans have only two months left in which to apply for conversion or re-instatement of their old National Service Life Insurance policies without medical examination, it was pointed out this week by Dolph Stuart, county service officer.

"This should be of special interest to those veterans who are drawing disability compensation," he added, "as no waiver is made on the compensable disability."
