Bert Clements was born May 30, 1924, in Wisconsin, and came to Oregon seven years ago. He was a veteran of the first world war, having served in the U. S. Army from 1918 to 1920. He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Post No. 101, Hillsboro, Ore.

Surviving are his wife, Emily, a daughter, Mrs. John Clements, and two sons, John and Glen. Mr. and Mrs. Clements settled at Cornish seven years ago and became renowned as peach growers. He was known for his civility and constant effort toward improvement and development.

For many years he was a foreign engineer for Standard Oil, residing in South American and Dutch West Indies.

Mr. Clements was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and American Society of Engineering.

Tommy Bechen Breaks Leg

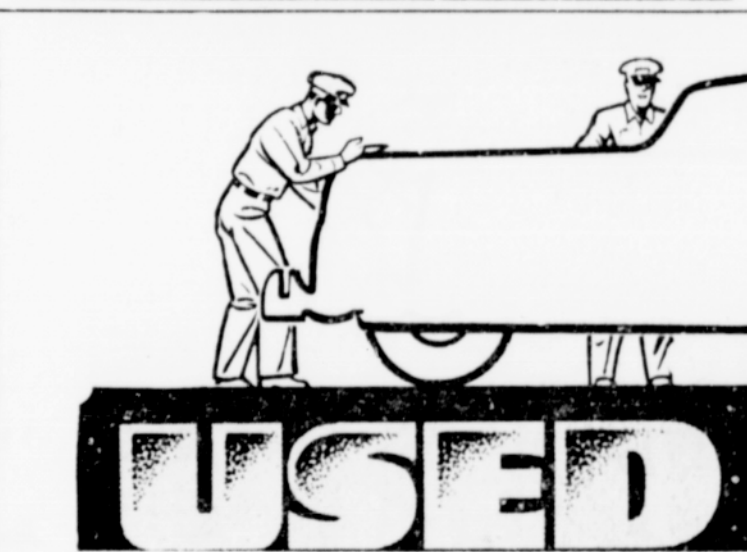
Tommy Bechen slipped off the running board of a truck and broke his leg below the knee last week while working in his uncle's farm. His leg will be in a cast for some time.
