Higher Salaries Raise Standards Of State Police

The last six months have proven that higher salaries which were authorized by the last legislature bring a hi-caliber type of personnel to the state police department. Sergeant Walter Hedfield, in charge of the Washington county state police district, told members of the local chapter of commerce Tuesday.

Hedfield, who has been with the department for 23 years, most of which time he spent in Hillsboro, said there could be no question but that the salary increase attracted individuals who would not consider police work under the old wage scale.

He said a patrol would be added to the new Sunset highway near the Washington-Multnomah county line as soon as the link is completed and the state police office would be located in the county. Motorcycle patrols will also be added in the future, he added.

Explaining the duties of the state police, Hedfield said they try to keep the highways safe, protect the public, and give any assistance possible.
