Freezers Explained
 At Extension Meet

Blueprints and slide pictures for the construction of a home freezer which can be built in 27½ hours were shown to 65 men and women at the county courthouse Friday.

"At least four inches of insulation used with a vapor barrier is necessary for a small freezer cabinet," declared M. G. Cropsy, associate professor of agricultural engineering, Oregon State college. "An insulation wall of larger thickness would make for more economical operation," he added.

Mr. Cropsy compared the use of home freezers with the commercial food lockers, and pointed out to farm families the economy of building a freezer at home if future plans include freezing a large share of the farm produce.

Detailed instructions and blueprints for building walk-in and top-opening food freezers which have a zero Fahrenheit capacity of 15 cubic feet to 160 cubic feet can be obtained from the local extension office in Hillsboro. Call or write for station circular 171, "Buying or Building a Home Freezer," by Mr. Cropsy.
