Spartans Rally To Tip Tigard Quintet, 32 to 28

Faced with a 13-point deficit at 22-10 early in the second half, Hillsboro's never-say-die basketball team rallied to tip Tigard, 32 to 28, in a Tualatin-Yamhill Valley League game Tuesday night.

Tigard headed the Spartans by 11 to 3 at the end of the first quarter and was still ahead by 23 to 18 at the end of the third period. In opening minutes of the game, Hillsboro had a large number of short shots but was unable to connect on most of them.

Randall Harrison, Bobby Frantz and Les Hershey started putting shots to touch off the big Spartan rally. Hershey led the locals in scoring with four field goals and one free throw for nine points. Harrison and Frantz followed with eight and seven, respectively.

The Tigers were stronger from the free throw line, connecting for 10 out of 15, while Hillsboro was content with four of 11.
