

Council Orders Station Plans; Budget Meet Set

Plans and specifications for the new fire station, as approved in a special bond election March 26, were ordered drawn by the council Tuesday night preparatory to calling for bids. The bonds were also ordered sold.

Annual city budget meeting was scheduled April 26 at 8 p. m. H. L. MacKenzie and W. H. Wieber were reappointed to the budget committee for three-year terms.

Street improvement ordinances were approved for the following streets: N. 6th, Jackson to Edison; N. 6th, Main to Lincoln; 40-foot pavement with curbs; E. Grant, 3rd to west line of Hillis addition; 36-foot macadam with curbs and an additional 8-foot parking area along the school grounds; N. 1st avenue, Jackson to northern city limits; widen existing pavement with macadam to 36 feet with curbs.

A resolution of intention to improve N. 5th, Edison to Grant, with a 36-foot pavement was approved following the presentation of a petition from a large percentage of the adjacent property owners. An improvement resolution calling for 36-foot macadam with curbs on S.

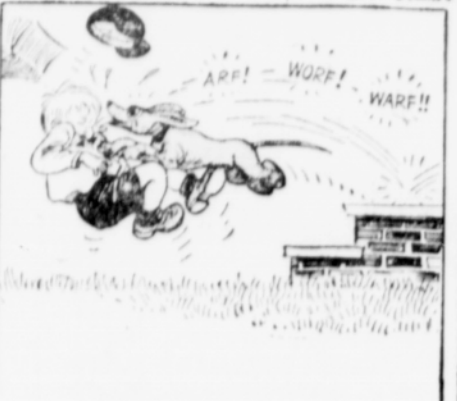
