

Unander Calls For Improving Schools, Roads

A part of Oregon's income tax surplus which is expected to exceed \$40 million by July 1, 1949, should logically be used for roads and schools—to improve the state's capital structure—Siegfried Unander, candidate for the Republican nomination for state treasurer, told Hillsboro Lions at their Wednesday noon luncheon meeting.

The surplus comes from corporate excise taxes and personal income taxes, which has been designated as an offset to property taxes, Unander explained. To make use of this money, it is necessary to vote property taxes and then have that amount offset by income tax money.

The speaker said it has been forecast that population in the Willamette valley may reach 5 million in the next 20 years. Unander said he advocates a good comprehensive program for state expansion "to meet the impact of increased population felt on all levels of gov-

ernment." He said the state hospital now has a capacity of only 2900 beds, far from adequate. He pointed out that 50 per cent of the voters are under 40 years of age and that the opportunity for service to the state should be accorded younger citizens.

Unander was introduced to the Lions club by Melvin G. Hieber. John Meeker told of plans for a visit of Oregon Advertising club representatives in Hillsboro Friday.

John Vickers spoke briefly of plans for the community Rose Festival float.

President Lynn Selfridge presided.

The measure, if passed, would include school districts 21, Academy; 41, Mountaindale; 43, Shady Brook; 51, Meacham; 52, Arcade; 68, Pleasant View; and 70, North Plains.

Grove Council Revises Rates

The Forest Grove city council Monday night passed a revised water rates ordinance which allows only a 50 per cent surcharge in suburbs rather than 100 per cent as was previously proposed. The action was taken as the result of a recommendation made by the consulting engineer.

The council decided to stand by its policy of allowing no additional outside connections to be made. Suburban residents who have been fighting the doubling of their water rates also have gone on record as opposing the connection restriction. The policy is not included in the ordinance, but was established by an earlier resolution.
