

Sub-Standard Rating Given Dilley School; Action Asked

A definite plan of correction must be submitted to County School Superintendent Austin Scraftford or the Dilley grade school district faces loss of \$6000 support from the basic school support fund for the coming year. This warning was issued to school directors last week by Scraftford after learning the Dilley school has been declared non-standard.

Scraftford pointed out that loss to the district would mean an extra local tax load of about 17 mills. The present school is a fire hazard and should be replaced at once as it is too outmoded to warrant repair, Scraftford added.

He suggested the school board appoint a committee of three to work with the board to investigate the probable cost of a new building, the possibility and cost of providing education elsewhere, and that the group report to the voters of the district soon so the matter may be officially decided at the annual school meeting June 21.

The report based on the findings of the state department of education examiner, indicated that 12 items need corrections if the school is to meet standards and participate in the state appropriation. The following corrections were recommended:

1. The school is not equipped with desks and seats that fit the pupils.
2. The desks which are acceptable need reconditioning.
3. Bulletin and chalk boards are inadequate.
4. Library facilities are inadequate.
5. Encyclopedias are outdated.
6. The teacher-pupil ratio was not excessive but should be reduced inasmuch as teachers have several grades plus extra duties.
7. Classroom lighting is inadequate.
8. Window shades are inadequate.
9. Custodial service is inadequate.
10. Safety and sanitary conditions need immediate attention.
11. Adequate covered play space is not available.
12. The building in general is outmoded, unsanitary and hazardous.
