## McMinnville Cindermen Take District 6 Honors

The McMinnville Grizzlies, winners of no higher than third place in the TVV track meet last month, Saturday came up with 36 points to take top honors in the district 6 track and field meet at McMinnville, Hillsboro, TVV track champions, placed in fifth spot with 24 1/2 points, one point below Seaside and 5 1/2 points below third-place St. Helens.

The meet, held in a cold wind and brief rain flurries to qualify trackmen for the state meet, wound up with Newberg in second place with 32 1/2 points, followed by St. Helens, Seaside and Hillsboro. Also-rans were Beaverton, 21 points; Scappoose, 16; Vernonia, 8; Forest Grove, 7; and Sherwood, 6 1/2.

Jerry Doyle and Wilbur Pearson brought home Jim Davis' only first place ribbons from the meet. Doyle skinned the low hurdles in 23.6 to lead the field after being beat out of first place in the high hurdles. He took second in the high hurdles. Pearson recorded a 5-foot 7-inch high jump for first in that event. Randall Harrison took third in the low hurdles and fifth in the 100-yard dash, and the Hills relay team took second in the 880-yard relay for the Spartans' only other points.

No records fell and Dave Earle of Seaside was the only man to win two events. He won first place in the shot put with a loss of 47 feet 5 1/2 inches and captured the discus with a heave of 135 feet 2 inches.
