

Tillamook Bank To Open Branch House Saturday

The new North Tillamook branch of the Commercial bank of Tillamook will open Saturday in quarters in the city hall in Wheeler, it was announced this week by Christensen, president of the Commercial bank of Hillsboro and Tillamook.

The branch, third to join the Commercial group, will hold open house from 2 to 6 p.m. Saturday. Robert D. Gruenig, formerly of Hillsboro and for the past two years a member of the Tillamook bank staff, has been named manager of the Wheeler branch.

The opening will bring to seven the number of banks and branches in the Commercial group. Christensen pointed out. The Tillamook bank is an affiliate of the Commercial National bank of Hillsboro. Other affiliates are at Banks and Newberg. A branch of the Banks bank is operated at Vernonia and a branch of the Newberg bank is operated at St. Paul.

The group has total deposits of approximately \$20,000,000, Christensen announced. The Commercial National bank of Hillsboro is an outgrowth of a merger in 1927 of the old Hillsboro Commercial bank and the Hillsboro National bank. The bank was reorganized in 1942 and again in 1947-48. It now has a staff of 38 officers and employees.

The Tillamook institution, which is establishing the new branch, was opened for business February 17, 1945, and now has deposits of approximately \$4,000,000. Don B. Peterson is vice-president and manager of the bank.

Other officers of the group are: J. L. Searcy, vice-president of the Hillsboro and Tillamook banks and president of the Newberg bank; Christensen, vice-president of the Banks and Newberg banks; Earle Bowman, vice-president of the Hillsboro bank and president of the Banks institution; G. F. Abts, cashier and assistant manager of the Tillamook bank.

cases (96,000 cans) of Friskies a day.

The horse meat is now being bought from an Idaho plant but will be purchased from an Oregon plant as soon as available. Richardson added. The company buys its meat only from plants approved by the bureau of animal industry.

Of the 20 employees held over for the new operation the average length of service for each is 18 years. Dave Miller is foreman and Charley Brevick chief maintenance man.

Thousands of tests were made with hundreds of dogs before the product was finally approved for production and distribution. Richardson said. Tests were conducted at the Albers Research Kennels and in Albers laboratories at Carnation Farm, Seattle. Albers is a subsidiary of the Carnation company.

The Carnation company first started operations in Washington county in 1902, when the name was Pacific Coast Condensed Milk company. In 1906 the Oregon Condensed Milk company in Hillsboro was purchased and Carnation has operated here continuously since that date. One section of the plant has been segregated to handle fresh milk. This is to be operated by Damascus Milk company, Carnation's fresh milk division.

Swimming Tests Passed by Eighty

Eighty swimming students from the B. W. Barnes grade school and local Boy Scout troops passed tests conducted during April by Jasper M. Rogers, Barnes school swimming instructor and Red Cross water safety director. The tests were made as a part of the school's weekly swimming and life-saving program conducted in the Shattuck high school pool in Portland.

Twenty-four beginners' certificates, 43 intermediate certificates, and 13 swimmers' certificates were issued by Rogers during the month. All but 20 of the certificates went to Barnes school students, the others going to local scouts.

Only two scouts failed in the intermediate class and one Barnes school student failed in the swimmers' class. They were to be given second tests later.

The program, started last fall by Rogers, will close April 20 with a recreational swim for students and scouts. About 55 students will take part in a recreational swim in the Portland pool tonight. Assisting Rogers in the classes are Miss Margaret Morgan and Walter L. Henry, principal of the Barnes school.
