Dewey Talk Draws Huge Crowd Here

ministration, saying the nation hasn't had "any leadership in our national government that knew where and when we were going." He said dozens of foreign diplomats had become discouraged with not knowing what the U. S. foreign policy is.

Competent Leaders Needed

"We must get some competent men to run our government and to sell to the world our freedom and enterprise," he added. Criticizing the manner in which American foreign aid has been administered, he said, "I propose we start getting something for it" and that the nation stop sending millions of dollars overseas "like soft-hearted saps."

He urged that the nation "start bringing some order out of this sprawling federal bureaucracy" and that the nation be made "so great that no dictator would dare start another war." Referring to the Northwest as the greatest store of water power and resources in the world, he said the United States could reach that strength "if we make no blunders."

Introduced by Mayor He was escorted to the speaker's table by John Meekie and Mervin W. Brink. Mayor E. A. Griffith made the introduction. Dewey spoke briefly with Queen LaVelle Tipton before and after his address and shook hands with scores of persons in the audience. He was the first presidential candidate to visit the city since William Jennings Bryan campaigned here 40 years ago.

He was escorted into the city by a large caravan of Young Republicans who almost brought the wrong bus into town. A group of University of Oregon dental school seniors approached the city in their chartered bus at about the same time Dewey's bus was due. The caravan followed the bus half-way into town before the driver stopped to inform the followers of his passengers.

The local Dewey supporters got back to their places with no harm done and properly escorted the candidate's bus into town.
