News Highlights Of the Week

Flood Waters Continue Drop—Floodwaters continued to drop six inches a day Wednesday and many occupants of waterfront property along the Willamette and Columbia can begin to think about the task of returning to it and rehabilitating it.

Submits Housing Plan—A proposal for federal financing of private and public permanent housing for Vanport flood refugees was laid before the senate Monday by Senator Guy Cordon of Oregon on behalf of the Pacific Northwest delegation.

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Cold War Brings Arrest Of Local GI by Russians

Disagreement over a three-year agreement between Soviet Russia and the United States led last month to the arrest by Russian military police of a Hillsboro army corporal and his buddy while on occupation duty in Vienna, Austria.

The incident occurred May 24 when Corporal Kenneth Voges, son of Mr. and Mrs. Otto Voges of 545 E. Jackson, was spending his day off duty boating on the Danube with another GI. On the way back to their billets, Voges said, they were arrested by the Russians while passing through the 21st district.

"We were just sauntering along minding our own business when a Russian jeep with two military police and an officer armed with Tommy guns stopped in front of us and asked if we were Americans," Voges wrote. "We said yes," he added, and "they ordered us to the jeep."

"They took us to their district office, then to the provost marshal's office, where we were asked many questions and our identifications and passes inspected. We insisted our military police be called. Our officers came and after much arguing with the Russians returned us to our station."

The Russians "insisted" the 21st district is off bounds to Americans, Voges added, and the Americans say it is open to Americans according to the 1945 agreement.

Voges has been military train dispatcher with the 524th military police in Vienna for two years.
