

Appreciation Democracy Cited by Austrian Woman

There is great strength in the democratic way of life, declared Miss Marie Penzance of Austria, now an instructor in foreign languages at Pacific University, in speaking before the Rotary club here Thursday.

"If Americans would go to Europe and see the things that I have seen, they would return and thank God that they live here," she said.

The American boy starts out here in a capitalist when he sells newspapers, etc., according to Miss Penzance, who pointed out that most everyone wanting an education can work his way through college here. In Europe, however, she said, there is practically no way to work one's way through college and the only way depends on dad having enough money.

Food, it was pointed out, is the big problem in Europe with Austria

being forced to import most of its food. Since the collapse of Austria-Hungary, Austria has been dependent on imports for its food. The people, she said, are working hard to bring about recovery, but most manufacturing plants are destroyed and there is little machinery and livestock. Coal must be imported. Practically everything that is manufactured must be imported in order to secure credits to obtain food.

Although Austria has an independent government, it has four occupying powers, according to the speaker, who said Russia would not leave until it is paid \$200,000,000 for German assets. The other allies, she said, have agreed to return their share of claims to Austria to aid in the country's recovery. The Communists decline to do this and although the country has oil resources, the Reds take it out and the U. S. has to bring it in, she said.

The Americans, she said, occupy that section of the country which has all the industry, most of the people and the best they could with the continuous worry as to what the Reds were going to do next. The main thing that would help, it was explained, would be for the Russians to move out. It is felt that if the Americans move out of the country, the Russians would take over their area.

There is a political vacuum in this small country one-third the size of Oregon with 6,000,000 people, they have lost their belief in things and don't know what is coming next, it was observed. They are looking to the United States not only for material help, but for faith and must know that America will back them up, she said.

Russians occupy countries in order to expand Communism, it was stated, and the people are selling themselves for food. This applies particularly to the young people who know little or nothing about democracy, it was held.

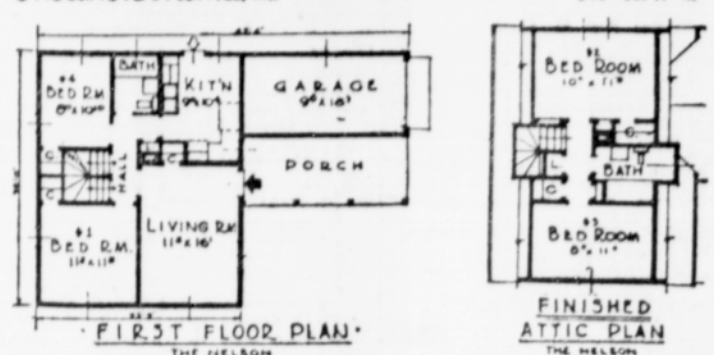
Rev. Neugebauer Goes on Vacation

THE NELSON—Flexibility is as important to a house plan as to an elastic band. In the design of The Nelson, the architect has achieved the utmost in flexibility so that the plan may be adapted to fit the varying needs of families of different needs and tastes.

First, it is a small house that looks much larger than it is because the garage is turned end-ways and a grandporch placed in front of it. It may be a two-bedroom, a three-bedroom or a four-bedroom house. It may have the conventionally sized living room shown in the floor plan here, or, by leaving out the partition between living room and front bedroom, might be built with an oversized living room, 22x16. The smaller downstairs bedroom might be a dining room and all sleeping confined to the second floor. Or, it might be a study. Or, the second floor may be left unfinished and the house built as a four-room bungalow. There are numberless possibilities.

The plan conforms to Federal Housing Administration construction requirements and to the standards of National Adequate Wiring Bureau. Architect's blueprints and specifications may be had from Housing Plan Service for \$7.50 per set—Write in care of the Argus.

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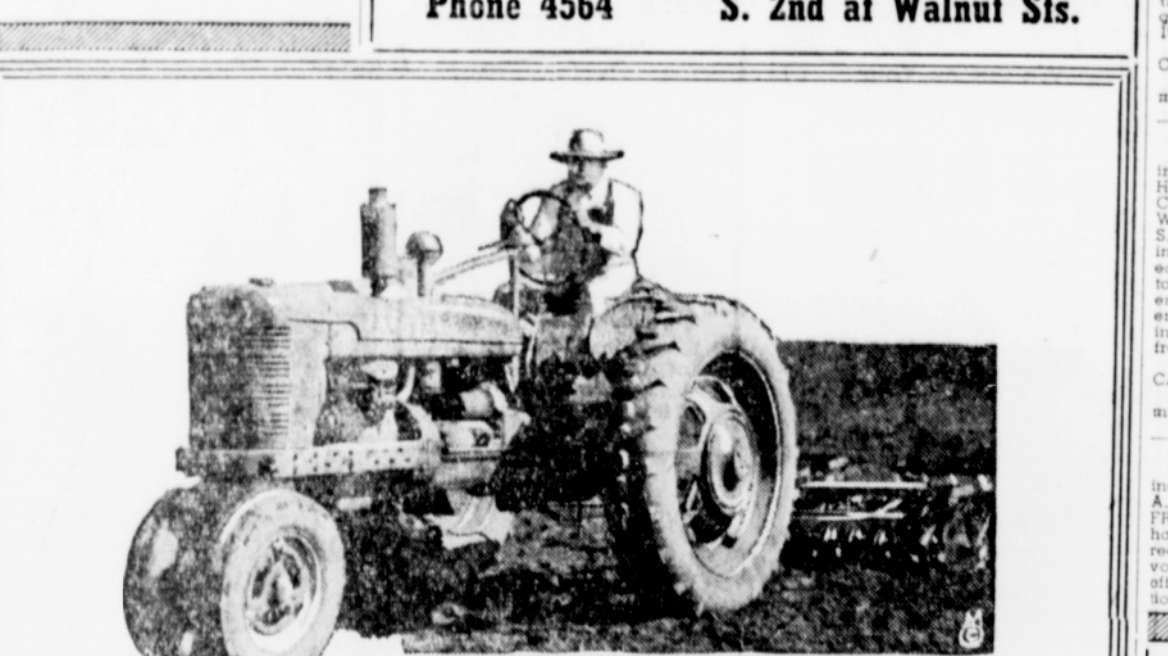
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
