The parade will travel down Main Street to Sixth Avenue, Sixth to Oak Street, East on Oak to Ninth and South on Ninth to Shute Park.

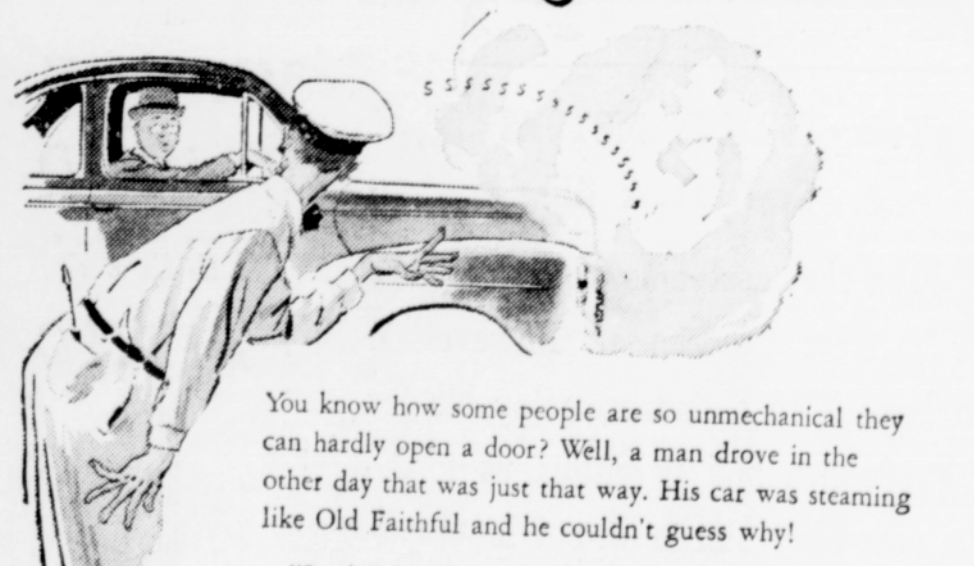
