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Market Value Given For Donated Foods

Fair market value of all donated commodities issued to Washington county for distribution to school lunch programs totaled \$13,500.77, according to Austin T. Scraftford, county school superintendent.

Dried eggs totaled \$3560 non-fat milk solids, 92 cases, \$130.22; grapefruit juice, 481 cases, \$1202.50; concentrated orange juice, 589 gallons, \$1382.80; fresh apples, 341 boxes, \$767.25; walnut meats, 40 cases, \$500.00; tomatoes, \$24.10; peanut butter, 34 cases, \$691.60.

Other items issued were: Tomato juice, 588 cases, \$235.20; prunes, 130 cases, \$373.75; raisins, 148 cases, \$399.60; peaches, 137 cases, \$443.25; cheese, 31 cases, \$483.60; fresh pears, 96 boxes, \$203.70; dried figs, 92 cases, \$262.20; potatoes, 148 sacks, \$592.

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Lutheran Church Cornerstone Laid Sunday

Rev. George Reule, pastor of the local Lutheran church laid the cornerstone of the new church building at a special service Sunday at 3 p. m. Rev. Reule stated, "I lay the cornerstone of an edifice to be here erected under the name of the Trinity Evangelical Lutheran church, and devoted to the worship of the one and only living ministry of His holy sacraments in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost."

Rev. E. Eichmann, pastor of the Trinity Lutheran church, Portland, delivered the address. The church choir, under the direction of Edwin Kiehaefer, rendered a special arrangement of "The Church's One Foundation."

The church is being constructed of red rock from the Red Rock Quarry near Carnas, Wash. The unique structure features Gothic design and promises to be one of the outstanding landmarks in the community. H. C. Whitehouse, the architect of Spokane, Wash., estimated the cost of the building at \$130,000. The plan provides a nave with 300 person seating capacity, parish hall, 10 Sunday school rooms, a recreational hall for youths, and a full basement under the nave.
