A fighting Tigard American Legion Junior baseball team threw a camper on championship hopes of Hillsboro.

The Tigard pushed across 12 runs in the last four innings on 13 hits, a wild pitch, three Hillsboro errors and two walks. The win gave Tigard a split in their two-game series with Hillsboro, the locals having won, 3 to 1, at Tigard June 9.

Hillsboro, obviously hurt by the loss in the fifth inning of Catcher Pete Klein and the resulting shift in positions, fell apart before the heavy bats of the Tigard club. Hillsboro was leading, 2 to 1, in a tight pitchers' battle when Klein left the same as a result of an injury.

The two teams are now tied for first place in the eastern division of district 1 with three wins and one loss each.

Tigard opened the scoring in the first inning with one run on a base on balls and a single. Hillsboro came back in the bottom of the first with two runs on two singles, a stolen base and two passed balls. Hillsboro's only other run came across in the seventh inning when Ron Reule singled and scored on Pitcher Dick Waibel's single.

The Tigard batters leveled off on Waibel's offerings for five hits in the top of the sixth inning to bring in four runs. Singles by Lewis, O'Halloran, Blost, Stevenson and Dolstrom put the visitors ahead, 3 to 2. Tigard added two more runs in the eighth on singles by Blost, Robertson, Dolstrom and Cagle.

Tigard batters continued their heavy barrage in the ninth with six runs off four hits, two walks, a hit batter and two errors. Singles by Robertson, Dolstrom, Stearns and Peterson were the telling blows. Every Tigard batter came to bat at least five times in the wild game.

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Flood Homeless Get Quick Help

All persons made homeless in the flooded areas of the Columbia river basin as a result of the recent floods will have equal right to purchase or rent newly constructed housing in that area, Housing Expediter T. E. Woods announced Monday, regardless of whether they are veterans of World War II.

Specifically, the housing expediter waived, until further notice, the provisions of the Veterans' Preference regulation requiring that preference be given to veterans of World War II or their families in the sale or renting of housing accommodations with respect to any housing accommodations in the Columbia river basin, if the construction was completed after June 30, 1947 and before April 1, 1949 and districts to file as soon as possible.

When the examination is completed by the family physician, the completed form should be filed in the county school superintendent's office or the public health department.

if such housing accommodations are rented or sold to persons rendered homeless in the flooded areas of the Columbia river basin as a result of the flood which commenced on or about May 24, 1948.

Title I of the Housing and Rent act of 1947, as amended, requires that all for-sale and for-rent housing other than that constructed for owner occupancy, completed after June 31, 1947 and before April 1, 1949, be offered exclusively to veterans or their families during construction and 30 days after completion. The effect of Monday's action is to waive this requirement.

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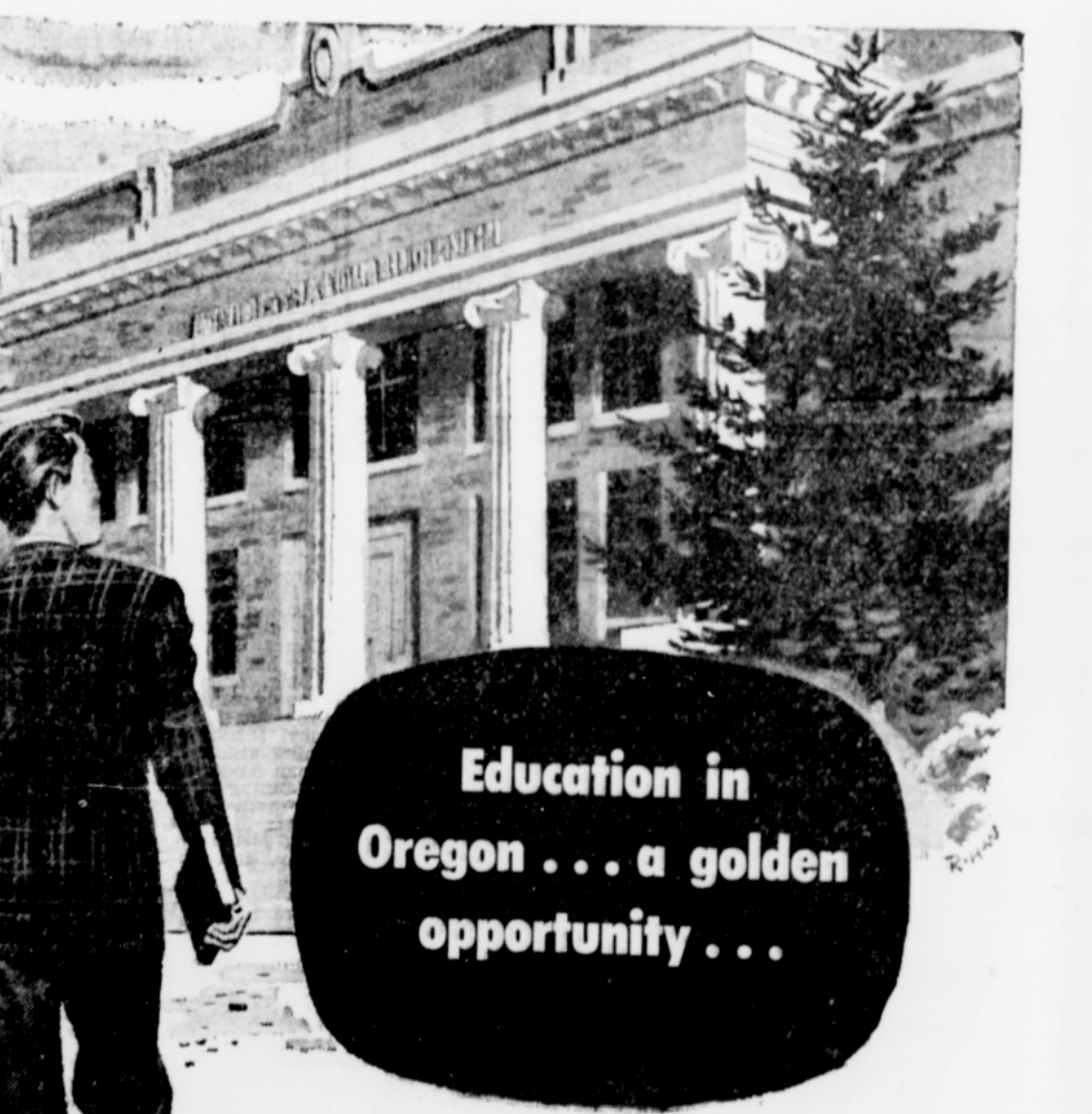
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
