Reds Sever Consular Ties
Soviet government has decided to sever all consular ties between the United States and Russia as a result of the Kasenkina case, the Moscow radio said Wednesday.

Order Consul Ouster
The United States Friday ordered the immediate ouster from its borders of Soviet Consul General Jacob Lomakin for official misconduct in the Kasenkina case, the Moscow radio said Wednesday.

Two Witnesses Contradict
Two key witnesses, one of whom was lying faced each other before the house communist investigators Wednesday and contradicted each

other under oath. They were Alger Hiss, former high-ranking state department official, and Whittaker Chambers, former communist and now a senior editor of Time.

Russians Seek Information
The army department said Friday Russia is increasing its intelligence activities in the United States and disclosed that American business firms have been warned to be on the watch for Soviet information requests.

U. S. Income at Record

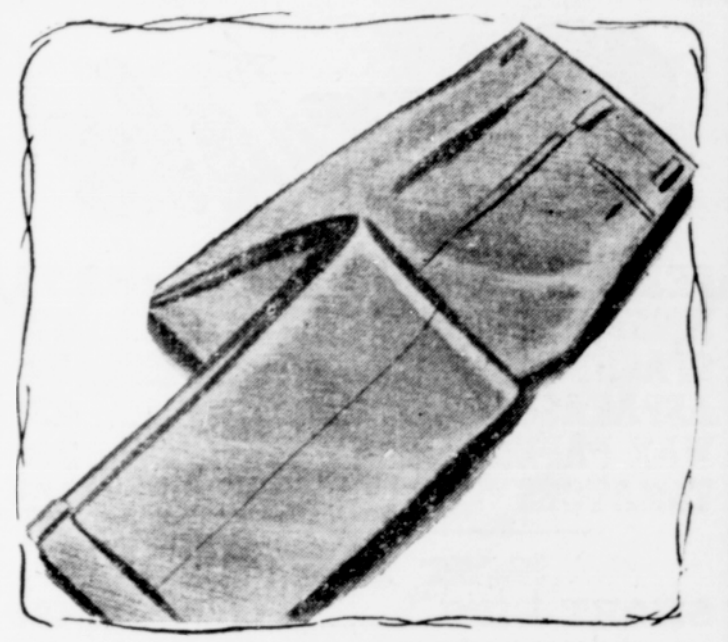
