

Cornelius, Tigard Win League Tilts

WASHINGTON COUNTY GRADE FLAG FOOTBALL

Cornelius and Tigard turned in victories as Washington county grade school flag football league play got under way last Friday. Hillsboro, beaten 14 to 6 by Cornelius in its opener, was to play host to Tigard Wednesday afternoon.

Tigard opened its season in the win column by edging Beaverton, 8 to 7, at home.

Cornelius' coach, Darrell Jones, says his team will attempt to keep its league record clear in a tilt against Beaverton Friday afternoon. The teams will play a double round-robin schedule during the season, each having six games.

The field is divided into five zones of 20 yards each for flag football and a first down is gained when the offensive team advances into the next zone. The flag is a piece 36x18 inches and is tucked inside the player's belt no more than 18 inches. The stop is considered made when the defense pulls the flag loose and drops it to the ground.
