

Hartrampf Tells Road Situation

Damage done to county roads by the recent snow and cold spell could not yet be determined until the cold weather breaks, according to Ross Hartrampf, county engineer. Trucks have been off because gravel has frozen and working conditions have been bad due to the intense cold, he declared.

Patching crews will begin operations as soon as possible and Jackson's quarry at North Plains, which has been shut down for some time, will be reopened, Hartrampf said.

County road crews have limited their operations to sanding and taking care of icy spots. Snow plows were in use after the snow fell, he said.

Road problems will all come at once, Hartrampf said. Oiled surfaces have been hurt and the thaw when it comes will bring lots of troubles with it, he added.

The county bridge a mile south of Buxton on the west fork of Dairy creek was completed yesterday (Wednesday) and is ready for use, the engineer declared.
