A real "woman story" is the article, which was written by Isabel Murray Hoyt. Mrs. Chandlee told the Argus she was interviewed for the Monitor several months ago and had forgotten all about it, but since it has appeared, she has been receiving letters from all over the country, offering her recipes, asking for work, and even wanting to buy fibers.

The article starts out by saying "Mrs. Chandlee is another proof that ever a depression cannot keep people from carrying out a good idea."

It was during the lean and discouraging 30's that she decided something had to be done about the fact that while fiber men are busy making money, the women are left with a lot of time on their hands.

The article went on to describe how they secured a railroad iron and mounted it on a wooden platform to serve as a cracker rack, and then she put in long hours at this task until they had a cracker rack that had just been invented in Portland. The Chandlees went in debt for \$35 to buy the cracker rack and at the end of seven weeks had the rack of their own with half a pound bag of nuts. They peddled these first in the grocery stores in eastern Oregon, finding they also
