Ford Motor company Sunday announced reductions from \$12 to \$120 on Ford, Lincoln and Mercury cars. The trend in the auto industry, "The reductions, attributed to the increased availability of materials and the small decrease in prices of some materials" was effective Monday.

Ford car list prices are dropped from \$12 to \$80. Mercurys from \$80 to \$120, and all Lincoln and Lincoln Cosmopolitan models are reduced \$100. Certain truck models are reduced \$10 to \$40.

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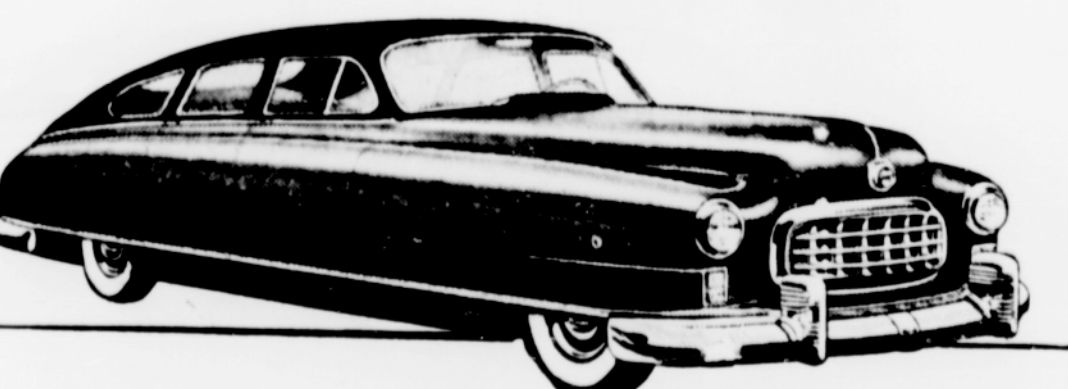
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
