### Berry Growers Mull '49 Outlook At Local Meeting

The strawberry outlook for 1949 was discussed by directors of the United Berry Growers of Washington County and County Agent Palmer Thorsen last week at a meeting of the organizations at the chambers of commerce rooms in Hillsboro.

Average is down slightly from last year and conditions in the fields do not appear as favorable as in 1948. Thorsen led the group.

Four out of five directors in the county reported that the average going out of production was about equal with new plantings indicating that the average to be harvested will be about the same.

Later plantings last year and weakening of plants have indicated that one-year-old plantings will not be as good as it was reported. Some were reporting a heavy weevil infestation.

Control on sheep sorrel has been disappointing. Thorsen reported. Some types of rotary hoes have helped in weed control, he added. He did not recommend a heavy application of gypsum, as reported. Some are dry season might make them harmful to strawberry plantings.

Leroy Mills stated that his experience with irrigation had been very helpful in furnishing a "boost" to the crop during the year in which it was applied.

The general opinion of those attending the meeting was that when other prices drop, berry prices will be indicated. It did not point to a great decrease in strawberry prices this year.

Voters Reject School Budget  
County voters rejected a rural school district budget of \$531,444.37 in excess of the six per cent limitation at an election held in the individual school districts Monday.

School Superintendant Austin Seraford reported. Incomplete returns show the measure was defeated by approximately 1500 to 1100 with 12 districts not reported. Seraford said. These districts will not affect the outcome of the election, he added. The proposed budget amounted to \$722,439.84.

Several districts must now levy taxes inside the six per cent limitation, four mills for elementary and ten for high school. Seraford declared. Individual districts must then go back at annual school meetings to report the amount outside the limitation.
