

TB Strikes 21 in County During 1948, Report Tells

Thirteen new cases of tuberculosis and eight deaths from the disease occurred in Washington county during 1948, according to the report submitted last Thursday night at the annual meeting of the Washington County Tuberculosis and Health association by Mrs. Zola Morgan, executive secretary.

In the county last year, 1947, persons had miniaturized chest X-rays with 434 showing negative results, 113 questionable or positive results, 23 showed pathology other than tuberculosis, the report indicated.

The regular chest X-ray survey was held in the county between September 28 and October 19, it was reported. Surveys were conducted at Garden Home, Cedar Mill, Beaverton, Aloha, Oregon, Hillsboro, Banks, Verbort, Scholls, Sherwood, Tigard and Forest Grove.

The association changed its name from Washington County Public Health association to "Washington County Tuberculosis and Health association" in April, 1948, the report stated.

The annual meeting of the state association in May was attended by Mrs. Morgan, Mrs. George Laver, Mrs. Gordon Addington and Mrs. R. L. Kingsbury and the Washington county delegation was presented with a certificate of service in health education work.

The association assisted in getting blood transfusions for a county resident who was having a major operation, also for a tuberculosis patient in a hospital who was being prepared for an operation.

The West Union Women's club purchased and delivered a ceiling projector for patients at the Salem Tuberculosis hospital.
