

Building Permits Slip During April As Lull Continues

Building permit applications, after making a jump during March from low totals early in the year, slipped back to a low \$36,199 figure during April, it was reported this week by City Recorder Edwin Bowman.

The addition of the April total brings the 1949 figure to \$112,856, far below the \$315,193 total after four months last year, when building reached an all-time peak in Hillsboro.

Bowman issued 15 permits in the month just past, with the largest one going to A. C. Benson for construction of a \$7000 duplex at 326 W. Baseline street, the 24x72-foot frame building will be finished in July, according to the permit application.

Other residential permits listing a substantial estimated building cost went to Maurice Krueger for construction of a \$3000 home at Eighth and Walnut streets, to K. P. Carter for building of a \$5000 residence at First and Edison streets, and to S. Jensen for construction of a \$5000 home at 161 N. Tenth avenue.

C. W. Struthers Services Held
