



War On Land Agents

There's a new Oklahoma land rush up Detroit way. But the promoters have run afoul of one of our largest institutions, the Army. To protect prospective purchasers, who may be led by owners or agents to believe they are not buying property in the Detroit dam pool, the Army is buying land for the government that is in the affected area.

The army engineers do not intend to evict anyone living or doing business in the area. As the property is acquired, the government will lease it back to the original owners at a fair market rental.

The reservoir area, including the town of Detroit, must be cleared and cleared early in 1951, said Col. O. E. Walsh, Portland district engineer.

Too Many Job-Seekers

Looking for a job can be at a premium at the Detroit dam site. Workers are flocking into the area by the hundreds from all over the country. Many men are already registered than will be needed on the dam for at least three years. Many of them are bringing their families and cannot find work to support them. Some are broke and seek relief. Some seek farmers' chickens—or what have you. It will be at least six months and perhaps a year before work on the dam will require large numbers of men.

May Honor Governor

McKay dam probably will be chosen as the name of the big project now under construction. Known as the Detroit dam, members of the Willamette basin commission started the move, an honor due the Governor because of his long service to the Willamette Valley Project. McKay has been chairman of the commission since its organization more than ten years ago and held the position actively until his election to Governor.

Naming the dam for Governor McKay would have to be done by Congress. Senator Guy Cordon has won the approval.

At the commission meeting here this week it was decided that the Willamette Basin Project, rather than the commission, should start and carry out the plan.

The condition of the locks at Oregon City was taken up by the commission which discussed the need of new locks, if industries are to be attracted to the area.

Good Tax News

Did you save a copy of that pecked old income tax return for 1948? It may be worth its weight in hundred dollar bills.

Tax Commissioner Earl Fisher has good news for many income tax payers. A large number of Oregon married couples have overpaid their state income tax for 1948. A new law makes it possible for husbands and wives to take advantage of the combined separate return form in cases where the latter method results in less tax.

If all income reported was lumped together, using but one column of the return, it is probable that a joint return made by the couple would result in a refund of the overpaid tax.

In such a case, the taxpayers were asked to split the income in two columns, labeled husband and wife, dividing the amounts equally in order to take advantage of the lower tax rates which this method provides. If a lesser tax is found due, an amended return may be filed. Such amended returns must be made before July 15.

Air Conditioning Capital

Air conditioning of the legislative chambers and several of the state offices in the Capitol is under way. The machinery for ventilation and air conditioning systems was made possible by an appropriation made in 1947 legislature. Shortage of materials postponed the \$80,000 project.

Clark Non-Committal

General Mark Clark, commander of the Sixth Army area, stopped this week in Salem to confer with both Governor Douglas McKay and Oregon's Adjutant General, Major General Thomas E. Riley.

Accompanying General Clark on the trip north that will take him to Fort Lewis were Mrs. Clark and his aide. In an interview the general stated that he had no comment to make on recent reports that said he is a possible successor to Governor McKay.

New Mill Law Hearing

The state legislature has called the hearing to be held in Salem May 13. The department has announced it will test each producer's bulk at least four times every six months, instead of three times as it now being done. The new schedule will call for 300 tests a week.

Traffic Wreck Cost Climbs During '48

Despite a decrease in fatalities, the actual cost of Oregon traffic accidents continued to climb during 1948, according to the Secretary of State Earl T. Newberry.

Direct cost of last year's automobile accidents is estimated at \$26,012,300. Newberry said. On the same basis, 1947 mishaps totaled \$25,977,400. These amounts do not include the expense of necessary governmental activities, such as police or investigation work.

A breakdown of the 1948 expenditures shows 413 deaths at a cost of \$7,470,000; 12,122 injuries at \$7,934,520; and 69,280 accidents at \$10,607,600. The statistical saving of \$448,000 from 27 fewer deaths in 1948 was more than wiped out by increases in both injuries and accidents, the secretary said.

He explained the calculable costs of traffic accidents include wage loss, medical expense, overhead cost of insurance, and property damage. In 1948, last year for which an analysis was made on a national basis, these costs averaged \$18,000 per death, \$690 per injury, and \$100 per property damage accident.

Wage loss includes temporary loss of wages due to inability to work, lower wages due to permanent total disabilities and deaths. Although the unit costs have not been adjusted to take into account intervening price increases, particularly in vehicles and repairs, they are considered adequate for comparisons.
