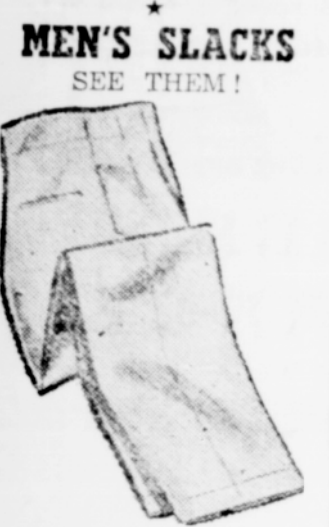

Mr. and Mrs. Charles Thompson of Kinton were dinner party guests of the parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Johnston, former residents.

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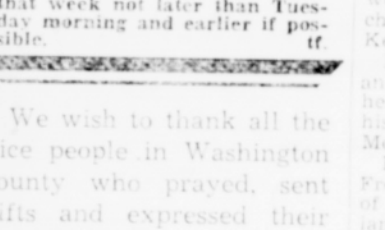
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Instructions for County Fair at Hazeldale Told

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Forrest Henning shot a deer last Sunday near Pumpkin Ridge. It was a three-year-old and weighed 136 pounds dressed.

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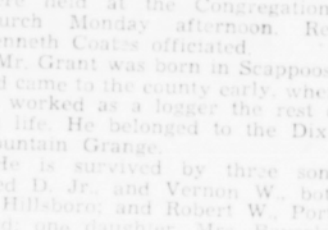
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Mr. and Mrs. Ben H. Higgins care for over 1000 White Leghorn hens, and say they haven't time to go deer hunting.
